CHARGERS

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by public authorities such as the Federal Communications Commission of the US Government (FCC), or by Industry Canada, is 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1 gram of body tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the mobile phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the mobile phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile phone. Before a mobile phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown. The highest SAR value for this model mobile phone when tested is 0.94 W/Kg for use at the ear and 1.29 W/Kg for use close to the body. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various mobile phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure. For bodyworn operation, the mobile phone meets FCC RF exposure guidelines provided that it is used with a non-metallic accessory with the handset at least 1.0 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. I.I Keys and connectors





Option key

- Touch: To use as **Menu** key, touch to access **Wallpaper**, **Manage applications** and **Settings**.
- Touch and hold: Open a list of thumbnail images of apps you've worked with recently. Touch a thumbnail image to open an app. Swipe it upwards or downwards to remove a thumbnail from the list.

Home key

• While on any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.

Back key

 Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the Notification panel, etc.

Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the pop-up menu to select from Power off/Restart/Airplane mode/Quick start.

Press and hold: Power on.

- Press to mute the ringtone when there's an incoming call.
- Press and hold for more than 7 seconds to restart the phone if the system has frozen.
- Press and hold the **Power** and **Volume down** keys to capture a screenshot.
- Press and hold the **Power** and **Volume up** keys in power off mode to restore factory settings.

Volume Keys

- In call mode, adjusts the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the ring tone volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.
- Press to light up the screen when it dims during a call.
- In Camera mode, when used as the capture key, allows you to take a photo.

I.2 Getting started

I.2.I Set-up

Inserting or removing the SIM card and microSD card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card and microSD card.



Your phone only support micro-SIM card. Please contact your network operator if you do not have a micro-SIM card.

To install, take off micro-SIM card protector, insert the micro-SIM card into the slot with chip facing downward, and then cover the slot.

To remove the card, open micro-SIM card protector, gently press it out, and then cover the slot.

Steps for removing and installing microSD card are the same with steps for micro-SIM card.

Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and outlet respectively.

• When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 5 hours).

You are advised to fully charge the battery (I). The charge status is indicated by an on-screen percentage reading while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.

- <u>ଡ</u>-
 - If the battery is very low, there will be no indication that power is being received until the charge is sufficient to show the charging status bar. To reduce power consumption and energy waste, once the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

I.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, Password, Pattern, Face unlock or Voice unlock) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen will then be displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

Set up your phone for the first time

Once you have powered on your phone for the first time, you should set the following options:

- Touch Get started..., then select the phone's language.
- Select your input keyboard, then touch Next.
- Select the SIM which you want to use, then touch Next.
- Set your date and timezone, you can also choose **Automatic time zone**, then touch **Next**.
- Setup your Google account: Touch Set up now. If you have a Google account, touch Yes to sign in, then enter your user name and password. If you forget your password, you can go to http://www.google.com/ to retrieve it. If you don't own a Google account, you are prompted to create one by touching Get an account. Touch Not now to skip to the next step.
- Touch **Next**, then the Setup complete screen displays, touch **Finish** to confirm.

If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and use some features.

1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the Power key from the Home screen, select Power off.

I.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) that you use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to the Home screen.



The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. The white short line at the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

I.3.I Using the touchscreen

Touch

To access an application, touch it with your finger.

⁽¹⁾ Depends on software version.

Touch and Hold



Touch and hold the Home screen to access the available options for setting the wallpaper.

Drag

Place your finger on any item to drag it to another location.

Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, web pages... at your convenience.

Flick

Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

Pinch/Spread

Place the fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better view.

From the status bar, you can view both phone status and notification information.

Notification panel

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



Touch one notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch the = icon to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).



1.3.3 Search bar⁽¹⁾

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



Search by text

- Slide the Home screen to the right, and then the search bar will appear.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch 🤇 on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

8 Search by voice

- Touch \bigcup from the Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone screen by creating a variety of patterns, PIN or password.

To create a screen unlock pattern (refer to section "Screen lock" for detailed settings)

- Drag down the Notification panel and touch A and then the Settings icon O to enter Settings, then touch **Security\Set up screen lock\ Pattern**.
- Draw your own pattern.



To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch Settings\Security\Set up screen lock\PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.

To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter your PIN or password to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen Slide as the screen lock, touch and drag the $\textcircled{\mbox{\sc on}}$ icon downwards to unlock the screen.



1.3.5 Personalize your Home screen

Add

Touch the Application tab $\underline{\boxplus}$, touch and hold an application or a widget to activate Move mode, and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

While adding an application to a Home screen, drag it to the top of the **App info** icon to view its detailed information. If the application is already downloaded, drag it to the top of the **Uninstall** icon to uninstall it directly.

Reposition

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favorite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate Move mode, drag the item up to the top of **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns red.

Create folders

To improve the organization of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen and the Favorite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it, touch the folder's title bar and input the new name.

Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold an empty area, a popup window named **Choose** wallpaper from will appear, offering a range of options. **Gallery** includes pictures you have taken, cropped or downloaded. **Live wallpapers** includes a scrolling list of animated wallpapers. **Video wallpaper** includes preset videos in the phone; and videos stored in your SD card and camera. **Wallpapers** includes all preset wallpapers in the phone. Slide left and right to locate a desired image, touch **Set wallpaper** to confirm.

1.3.6 Application tab

Touch $\underbrace{\texttt{IIII}}$ on the Home screen to enter the applications and widgets list.

To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key.

Consult recently-used applications

To consult recently-used applications, you can touch and hold the **Option** key. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the related application. Touch one thumbnail and slide it upwards or downwards to delete it. You can also touch and hold the app and touch **Remove from list** to delete it.



1.3.7 Volume adjustment

Using the Volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates. Press the **Volume down** key once more to activate silent mode.

Using Settings menu

Drag down the Notification panel and touch $\frac{2}{2}$ and then the Settings icon O to enter **Settings**, then touch **Sound**. You can set the volumes of ringtones, notifications, system sounds etc. to your preference.

Onscreen Keyboard settings

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings Language & input**, touch the Settings icon O on the right of **Android keyboard** or **Swype.** Settings are available for your selection from the displayed series.

Adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (on the application list, touch **Settings\Display\Orientation**).

2.1.1 Android keyboard



Touch & hold to show input options; when Wi-Fi or data connection is on, touch to enter voice input.

Touch to switch between symbol and numeric keyboard.

2.1.2 Swype keyboard

Swype lets you enter a word with one continuous motion: just drag your finger over the letters in the word.

- Place your finger on the key with the first letter of the word and drag your finger to each subsequent letter without lifting your finger off the screen.
- Continue until you have finished the word. Lift your finger after the last letter.
- If Swype cannot clearly determine your word, the word choice window opens. Select an alternative word from the list.



2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- · Touch and hold or double-tap within the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will appear: Select all \swarrow , Cut \square , Copy \square and Paste \triangleq .
- Touch the icon
 v to confirm.

You can also insert new text

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tabs will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show **PASTE** icon which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied.



3 Phone call, Call log and Contacts

3.1.1 Placing a call

The user can easily start a call using the **Phone** application. Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and select **Phone**.

Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from **People** or **Call log** by sliding or touching tabs, then touch **Call** to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to People by touching \ddagger and selecting Add to Contacts.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching . To hang up a call, touch $\pmb{\mathsf{End}}.$

International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold **•** to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch **Call**.

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch **Call** to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call, touch (S).

- · Slide to the right to answer;
- Slide to the left to reject;
- Slide upwards to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the **Volume up/down** key or turn the phone face down if **Turn over to mute** is activated. To activate, touch **Settings\Gestures\Turn over to mute**.

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold 1 on the **Phone** tab.

To set your voicemail number, touch and touch **Settings\Voice call** Voicemail.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon $\mathbf{Q}\mathbf{O}$ appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch **New Voicemail** to hear it.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume up/down key.



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Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.

Touch to display Dialpad.

- Touch to end the current call.
- Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.

Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.

Touch and select Start recording to record.



3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, you can now switch between two lines. The current call is put on hold and you can join the other call.

Conference calls⁽¹⁾

To set up a conference call:

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch and select Add call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to the conference and touch **Call**. You can also add participants from **Contacts** or **Call log**.
- Touch the 🙏 icon to start a conference call.
- During a conference call, touch 🛃 to drop a participant or to talk privately to one of the participants. Touch **End** to drop the participant from the conference, touch 📑 to talk privately to the participant and hold the other participants.
- Touch End to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Call settings

Touch and select **Settings** from the Dial screen. The following options are available:

• Voicemail

- **Voicemail settings** If you are using your carrier's voicemail service, this opens a dialog box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail. • Call forwarding

Touch to configure how your calls are forwarded when you are busy, unanswered or unreachable.

• Call barring

You can activate or deactivate call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

Other settings

• Fixed Dialing Numbers

Fixed Dialing Number (FDN) is a SIM service mode, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers which their children can dial.

For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

• Minute reminder

Mark the checkbox to enable minute reminder at 50s of every minute during a call.

• Vibrate reminder

Mark the checkbox to enable vibration when the call is connected.

• Turn over to mute

Mark the checkbox to mute incoming calls by turning the phone over.

• Power key ends call

Mark the checkbox to end a call by pressing the **Power** key.

• Dual mic noise reduction

Mark the checkbox to turn on dual mic for noise reduction.

• Quick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

^(I) Depending on your model.

• TTY mode

TTY mode can be used by people who are deaf, have poor hearing or speech impairments.

After connecting the cell phone and a TTY machine, the machine will convert incoming speech to text for the person using the TTY and converts outgoing text from the TTY machine to spoken voice for the person on the other end of the conversation.

• International dialling assist

Mark the checkbox to activate.

3.2 Call log

You can access your call memory by touching \bigcirc from the Dial screen. Touch \bigotimes on the right side of the contact/number to place a call directly. There are three kinds of calls in Call log:



- Outgoing calls (green arrows)
- Missed calls (red arrows)

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **People** (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

Touch the photo $\prod_{i=1}^{n}$ to open the Quick Contact panel.

To clear the entire call memory, touch = and **Delete**.

3.3 People

The **People** app enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

3.3.1 Consult your contacts

To access the **People** app, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then select **People**.



Touch to display contacts list option menu.

The following actions are enabled:

- **Delete contact** Select and delete unwanted contacts.
- Contacts to display Choose contacts to display.
- Import/Export Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and microSD card, or share contacts.
- Accounts Manage the synchronization settings for different accounts.
- Settings Access contact display settings.
- Share visible Share contacts with others by sending the contacts contacts vCard to them via Bluetooth, Email, SMS, etc.

3.3.2 Managing contact groups

The contact group helps you to improve the organization of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Contact group** screen.

Touch the $\underbrace{84}{9}$ icon to view local groups. To create a new group, touch the $\underbrace{84}{9}$ icon, enter the new name and touch **DONE** to confirm. If you have added accounts to your phone, touch the $\underbrace{84}{9}$ icon to view groups in accounts.

3.3.3 Adding a contact

Touch the Ω_{+} icon in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.



If you want to add more information, touch $\mbox{\bf Add}$ another field to add a new category.

When finished, touch **DONE** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch CANCEL.

Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch \bigstar to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch 🚖 on contact details screen.



Only phone contacts can be added to favourites.

3.3.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch in the contact details screen, then touch **Edit.** When finished, touch **DONE**.

Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A \checkmark appears after the number.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

Set the ringtone for a contact

On the contact's detail screen, touch to display the list options menu, touch **Set ringtone**.

Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch = and touch **Delete** from the contact (details) screen.

On the contacts list screen, touch = and then **Delete contact**, select the contact(s) you want to remove and touch \checkmark to confirm. Touch **Select all** and then \checkmark to delete all contacts.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

3.3.5 Communicating with your contacts

From the contacts details screen, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call, touch the % icon on the right side of the number.

To send a message, touch the \bigcirc icon on the right side of the number.

Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number or the \bigcirc icon for the way you want to connect.



The icons available on the Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications/accounts on your phone.

3.3.6 Contacts importing, exporting and sharing

This phone enables you to import contacts from a SIM card/microSD card and export contacts to a microSD card which can then be used to back up your information.

From the Contacts screen, touch to open the options menu, touch **Import/Export**, then choose to import/export contacts from/to SIM card, Phone, SD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

To import/export a single contact from/to a SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), select the contact you want to import/export, and touch \checkmark to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to a SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), touch **Select all** and touch \checkmark to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch a contact you want to share, touch \equiv and **Share** from the contact details screen, then select the application to perform this action.

3.3.7 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch and then **Contacts to display** from the contacts list screen, then you can choose which contacts to display.

By touching and then **Settings**, you can **Sort list by** Given name or Family name, as well as **View contact names as** Given name first or Family name first.

3.3.8 Joining/Separating contacts

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch = and then **Edit**, then touch = in the edit screen and touch **Join**.

Then, you will be required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch = and then **Edit**, then touch = in the edit screen and touch **Separate**, touch **OK** to confirm.

3.3.9 Synchronizing contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account set-ups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, touch the account you want to delete, touch == and then select **Remove account**, then confirm.

Sync

You can synchronize an account on the **Accounts** screen. Touch an account in the list, then touch = and select **Sync now**.

4 Messaging, Email

4.1 Messaging.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this mobile phone.

To access this feature, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Messaging**.



All messages you receive or send out can only be saved in the phone's memory. To consult messages stored in the SIM card, touch from the Messaging screen, then touch **Settings\Text** messages (SMS)\Manage SIM messages.

4.1.1 Writing a message





For saved contacts, touch the photo to open the **Quick Contact** panel to communicate with the contact. For unsaved contacts, touch the photo to add the number to your **Contacts**.

Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on the **Type person's** name or number bar or touch \mathcal{D}_+ to add recipients, touch the **Type text message** bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch \geq to send the text message.

An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific (accented) letters will increase the size of the SMS, which may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **Type person's name or number** bar, touch the **Type text message** bar to enter the text of the message. Touch = to open the option menu, touch **Add subject** to insert a subject, and touch @ to attach a picture, video, audio and so on.

When finished, touch $\sum_{i=1}^{MS}$ to send the multimedia message.

Attachment options:

- Capture picture Access the Camera to capture a new picture for attaching.
 Pictures Access the Gallery or File manager to select a picture as an attachment.
 Capture video Access the Camcorder to record a new video for attaching.
 Videos Access the Gallery or File manager to select a video as an attachment.
 Record Audio Enter the voice message recorder to record a voice message for attaching.
- Audio
 Access a selection of audio files for attaching.
- Contact Access People to select one or more contact(s) to attach.
- Calendar Access Calendar to select one or more event(s) to attach.
- Slideshow
 Enter the Edit slide show screen, touch Add slide to create a new slide, and touch a currently existing slide to edit it (see following picture). Touch to get more options, like slide duration setting, adding music, etc.



4.1.2 Manage messages

When a new message comes, a \bigcirc icon will appear on the status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open it. You can also access **Messaging** and touch the new message to open it.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter the message composing screen, enter the text, then touch \triangleright .

Touch and hold a message in the message details screen, the following options will be available:

- Copy This option is only available for SMS. Touch to copy current message content and paste it to the Type text message bar of the new message you are going to compose.
- Forward Touch to forward the message to another recipient.
- Delete message Delete the current message.

 Lock/Unlock message 	Touch to lock/unlock the message so it can't/can be deleted if you reach the maximum number of stored messages.
 View message details 	Touch to view details of the message.
• Select text	Touch to select the message text to copy, cut, add to dictionary, etc.
• Save message to SIM card	This option displays when the message is an SMS. Touch to save the message to the SIM card.

4.1.3 Adjust message settings

In the message list screen, touch _____ and select **Settings**.

Text messages (SMS)

- Delivery reports Mark to request a delivery report for each text message you send.
 Manage SIM Touch to view or manage messages on your SIM

- Edit quick text Touch to add or edit message templates.
- SMS service center Touch to view or edit your SMS service center.

- SMS storage Touch to choose either phone or SIM card for location storing messages.
- Alphabet Touch to select auto format, super compact or management precise mode.

Multimedia messages (MMS)

- Group messaging Mark the checkbox to send a single message to multiple recipients.
- Delivery reports Select to request a delivery report for each multimedia message you send.
- **Read reports** Select to request a report on whether each recipient has read a multimedia message sent by you.
- Send read report Select to request a report on whether the multimedia message has been sent out.
- Auto-retrieve Select to download full MMS message (including message body and attachment) automatically to your phone. Otherwise, download only the MMS message header.
- Roaming autoretrieve
 Select to download full MMS message (including message body and attachment) automatically when roaming. Otherwise, download only the MMS message header to avoid extra charges.
- Creation mode
 Touch to set MMS creation mode when composing
 messages.
- Maximum Select to edit the message size limit, but it should not be more than 300KB.
- Priority Set MMS priority as High, Normal or Low.

- Select to display message notifications in status bar.
- Mute Select to mute phone notifications when receiving a new message.
- Select ringtone Touch to select a ringtone as a new message notification tone

4.2 Gmail/Email

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail account or to create a new Email account.

4.2.1 Gmail

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organized by labels instead of folders.

To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

Gmail displays messages and conversations from one single Gmail account at a time, if you own more than one account, you can add an account by touching and selecting **Settings** from the Inbox screen, then touch **ADD ACCOUNT**. When finished, you can switch to another by touching the account name from Inbox screen, then select the account you want to view.

To create and send emails

- Enter recipient(s)'s email address in the **To** field, and if necessary, touch = and select **Add Cc/Bcc** to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.

- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch = and select Attach picture or Attach video to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch the >> icon to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch and then Save draft or touch the Back key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels, then select Drafts.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch $\begin{tabular}{c} \end{tabular}$ and then touch $\begin{tabular}{c} \end{tabular}$

To add a signature to emails, touch = and then touch **Settings** from the inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and a \bowtie icon will appear on the Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, recipient, subject, etc.

- Touch the Q icon from the Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the search box and touch on the software keyboard.

To reply or forward emails

- Reply When viewing an email, touch is to reply to this mail.
 Reply all Touch is and select Reply all to send messages to all people in a mail loop.
 Forward Touch is and select Forward to forward the
 - **Forward** Touch and select **Forward** to forward the received mail to other people.

Managing Gmails by Labels

To label a conversation when reading a conversation's messages, touch and **Change labels** to assign a label for the conversation.

To view conversations by labels when viewing your inbox or another conversation list, touch your account name, then touch a label to view a list of conversations within that label.

To manage labels, touch and **Settings**, then touch your account and select **Manage labels**.

Touch and hold a message thread to display the following options:

Besides your Gmail account, you can also set-up external POP3 or IMAP email accounts in your phone.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set-up an email account.

• Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set-up.

- Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Alternatively, you can touch Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- · Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.
- To add another email account, you can touch = and Settings, and finally touch ADD ACCOUNT on the right of the title to create the account.

To create and send emails

- Touch the 🚬 icon from the Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the To field.
- If necessary, touch and touch Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind carbon copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch _____, touch Attach file to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch >> to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch = and **Save draft** or touch the **Back** key to save a copy.

Google's instant messaging service, Hangouts, lets you communicate with your friends whenever they are connected to this service.

To access this feature and sign in, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Hangouts**. All friends added by using Hangouts from the web or phone will be displayed in your friends list.

To sign out, touch from the Friends list screen to display options, then touch **Settings\Sign out**.

4.3.1 Chatting with your friends

To start a chat, touch the name of a friend in your Friends list, then type your message and finally touch >.

You can invite other friends to join in a group chat by touching = and selecting **Add people** on the group chat screen and then selecting the friend you want to add.

4.3.2 To add a new friend

From the Friends list, touch the + icon to add a new friend. Type the name, email or number of the friend you want to add, and then touch **Message** or **Video call** to start a chat.

A notification of this invitation will be received by the friend. By touching the invitation, the friend can select **Decline** or **Reply** in response.

4.3.3 To manage your friends

Besides adding new friends to your friends list, touching and selecting **People & options** from your Chatting screen will make the following actions available:

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Touch to add the person to a new group Hangout.

- Rename Touch to rename Hangout.
- Notifications Mark the checkbox to be notified of new messages.
- Leave Touch to leave Hangout.
- O Touch to add the person to your circles of Friends, Family, Acquaintances or Following.

4.3.4 Settings

Archived

Hangouts

A series of settings are available for your selection by touching from the Friends list screen.

- Hangout requests Touch to view hangout requests which you receive when someone sends you a message or invites you to a video call for the first time.
- Snooze notifications
 Touch and select how long you'd like to go without receiving Hangouts notifications. This setting will temporarily disable notifications about new messages and video calls.
 - Touch to display all archived Hangouts that have been prevented from displaying in the Hangouts list. To unarchive a Hangout, touch and hold it until \checkmark appears, touch and select **Unarchive**.
- Settings Touch to open further personal settings for every Hangout you have.
- Send feedback Touch to send your feedback for Hangouts.
- Help Touch to view Hangouts help through your selected app.

5 Calendar & Alarm clock & Calculator.....

Use the Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

To change your Calendar view, touch the date title to open a drop-down menu for your options. Touch the $[1^{++}]$ icon to return to Today's view.



5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch the + icon to access the new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All day**.
- When finished, touch **DONE** from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Day or Week view screen, touch and hold an empty spot or an event to open the Option menu, then touch **New event** to edit the event details. Or you can also touch an empty spot until it turns orange, then tap again to enter a new event editing screen.

5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To share, delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter the details screen, touch the \leq icon to share the event with other people by Bluetooth, Email and messaging, etc., touch the \swarrow icon to edit the event, and touch the $\frac{2}{2}$ icon to delete.

5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon **T** will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the event name to view the Calendar notification list.

Touch **Snooze** to turn off all event reminders for 5 minutes.

Touch the **Back** key to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the Notification panel.

Important options activated by touching $\stackrel{}{=}$ from the Calendar main screen:

- Refresh
 To refresh the calendar.
- Search To search in the calendar.
- Calendars to display To show or hide, remove or add calendars.
- Clear events To clear events in the calendar.
- Go to Select to go to a specific date.
- Settings To set a series of Calendar settings.

5.2 Time.....



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Time**.

Touch 🚺 Alarm to add or set an alarm.

5.2.1 To set an alarm

From the **Time** screen, touch (1) to enter the **Alarm** screen, touch + to add a new alarm. The following options will appear:

- Label Touch to set a name for the alarm.
- Repeat Touch to select days when you want the alarm to work.
- Volume Slide to adjust the volume for the alarm ringtone.
- Vibrate Select to activate vibration.
- **Ringtone** Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm.
- Time Scroll up or down to select the time for your alarm.

When finished, touch **OK** to confirm.

Touch and hold an already existing alarm and touch **Delete alarm** to delete the selected alarm.

5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Turn over to

activate

Touch the Menu icon O from the Alarm screen. The following options will be available:

- Alarm in silent Select to play alarm with sound or vibration even when the phone is in Silent mode.
- **Snooze duration** Touch to set temporary turn off time of an alarm.
- Auto-silence Touch to set the duration of alarms.
- Volume buttons
 Touch to set side Volume up/down key
 behaviors when alarm sounds: None, Snooze
 or Dismiss.
 - Touch **Turn over to activate** to choose the status **Snooze** or **Dismiss**. Touch the switch to turn on/off snoozing or to dismiss the alarm by turning over the phone.
- 5.3 Calculator t

With the Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.

There are two panels available: Basic calculator and Scientific calculator.

To switch between panels, touch from the basic panel to open the option menu and touch **Scientific calculator**; or under auto rotation mode, rotate screen automatically to switch between Basic calculator and Scientific calculator.

Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed, enter the second number, then touch "=" to display the result. Touch to delete digits one by one, touch to delete all at one time.

When some numbers or operations have been entered, touch and hold the enter bar to open a menu offering further operations:

- Cut To cut selected text.
- Copy To copy selected text.
- **Paste**⁽¹⁾ To paste what you have previously copied to the entering bar.

To connect to the internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/3G /4G networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

6.I Connecting to the Internet

6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G

You can touch $\textcircled{\baselinetwidth}$ on the Quick setting bar to connect to the network.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then touch **Settings\More...\Mobile networks\ Access Point Names** or **Network operators**.

To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Touch 🙆 on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Mobile networks\Access Point Names
- Then touch and select **New APN**.
- Enter the required APN information.
- When finished, touch 🚞 and **Save**.

⁽¹⁾ Option will not appear unless copy or cut operation has been made.
To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect a data service.

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch SIM management\Roaming\Data roaming.
- Mark/Unmark the checkbox to activate or deactivate data roaming.
- When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "**6.1.2 Wi-Fi**").

6.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch (a) on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch the 🔲 🖸 switch beside Wi-Fi to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- Touch **Wi-Fi**, the detailed information of detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect with. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (contact your network operator for details). When finished, touch **Connect**.

To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Wi-Fi, then and select Advanced.
- Mark/Unmark the Network notification checkbox to activate/ deactivate this function.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Wi-Fi, and then touch + .
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch Save.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, touch and hold the name of the saved network.
- Touch Forget network in the dialog that opens.

6.2 Br

Browser.....

Using the Browser, you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\textbf{Browser}}.$

To go to a web page

On the Browser screen, touch the URL bar at the top and enter the address of the web page.



The URL bar will hide after a few seconds. To show the URL bar, you can touch and slide down the screen.

To set a homepage

- Touch from the Browser screen to display the option menu, touch **Settings\General\Set home page**.
- Choose a page or most visited website as your homepage.
- If you choose **Other**, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your homepage, touch **OK** to confirm.

6.2.1 Viewing web pages

After opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

To zoom in/out of a web page

Pinch/Spread your finger on the screen to zoom out/in of the web page.

To quickly zoom into a section of a web page, double-tap on the section you want to view. To return to normal zoom level, double-tap again.

To find text on a web page

- Touch = from the web page screen, then touch **Find on page**.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- The first word with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen, and subsequent matches will be boxed.
- Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- When finished, you can touch \checkmark or the ${\bf Back}$ key to close the search bar.

Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text on a web page:

- Touch and hold the text to highlight it.
- Move the two selecting tabs in orange to locate the text. Or touch **SELECT ALL** to select all words in this web page.
- Touch : to show further options, including Copy, Share, Find and Web Search.
- When finished, touch \checkmark or the **Back** key to deactivate the mode.

To open new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.

- Touch 🛃 to open all windows' thumbnails.
- Slide up and down to view all windows, touch one to view it.
- Touch 🕂 to open a new window.
- Touch and select **New incognito tab** to open a window without any trace.
- \bullet To close a window, touch \bigotimes on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

6.2.2 Manage links, history, downloads

To manage a link, phone number or address displayed on a web page

- Link Touch the link to open the web page.
 Touch and hold the link to open options for further operation, like opening in new window, saving link, copying link URL, etc.
 Phone number Touch to call the phone number.
- Address
 Touch to open Google Maps and locate the address.

To view Browser history

- Touch == from the Browser screen.
- Touch Bookmarks/History.
- Touch the **HISTORY** tab to view browser history.
- Touch SAVED PAGES to view the pages you saved.

To download a web application/view your downloads

Before downloading a web application, you need to enable your phone to install web applications (touch the Application tab from the Home screen, touch **Settings\Security**, mark checkbox of **Unknown sources**, finally touch **OK** to confirm).

To download an item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, touch and hold the item to be deleted, and touch $\frac{1}{2}$ to confirm.

To view items you have downloaded, touch the Application tab, then touch **DOWNLOADED**.

Manage bookmarks

To bookmark a web page

- Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch and touch Save to bookmarks, or from the History screen, touch the star beside the URL
- Enter the name and the location if needed and touch **OK** to confirm

To open a bookmark

- Touch and touch **Bookmarks/History**, or touch the 🚺 icon to enter the **Bookmarks** screen.
- Touch the bookmark you want to open.
- You can also touch and hold to display the options screen, then touch Open or Open in new window.

Touch and hold a bookmark in the bookmark list to view additional options:

- Edit bookmark Touch to edit information of the bookmark.
- Add shortcut to To add a bookmark shortcut to the Home Home screen.
- Share link To share the bookmark.
- Copy link URL To copy the bookmark link.
- **Delete bookmark** Touch to delete the bookmark.

- **Text encoding** Touch to select the character-encoding standard.
- Reset to default Touch to clear all browser data and to reset all settings to default.

Bandwidth management

- Search result Touch to enable/disable browser to preload preloading search results in the background.
- Web page Touch to enable/disable browser to preload the linked web pages in the background.
- Load images Mark to display images on web pages.
- Labs
- Quick controls Mark to enable quick controls.
- Full screen Mark to use the full screen mode.

6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices⁽¹⁾

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Bluetooth**. Your device and other available ones will show on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch 🐼 on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch 🔲 💿 to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognizable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch and select **Rename phone**.
- Enter a name, and touch Rename to confirm.

To make device visible

- Touch
 on the Quick setting bar to get to Settings.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- Touch and select **Visibility timeout** to select the visible time.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch ② on the Quick setting bar to get to Settings.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch SEARCH FOR DEVICES.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- · A dialog will popup, touch Pair to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone will connect with the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch the Settings icon 📑 beside the device you want to unpair.
- Touch Unpair to confirm.

6.4 Connecting to a computer

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between micro SD card/internal storage and a computer.

Before using MTP or PTP, first mark **USB debugging**.

 To access this function, touch Settings\About phone, then touch Build number 7 times. Then touch Settings\Developer options\ USB debugging.

⁽I) You are recommended to use ALCATEL ONETOUCH Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your phone. You can go to www.alcatelonetouch.com for more information about the ALCATEL ONE TOUCH Bluetooth headset.

To connect/disconnect your phone to/from the computer:

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- If you use mass storage, open the Notification panel and touch USB connected, then touch Mount in the dialog that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.
- If you use MTP or PTP, your phone will be automatically connected.

To disconnect (from mass storage):

- Unmount the microSD card on your computer.
- Open the Notification panel and touch Turn off.



For Windows XP or lower operating systems, you should download and install Windows Media Player I I on your computer from the following link: http://windows.microsoft.com/en-CA/ windows/download-windows-media-player.

To locate the data you have transferred or downloaded to the internal storage:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen to open the applications list.
- Touch File Manager.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Manager**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install applications on your phone, etc.

To format a microSD card

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Storage.
- Touch **Format SD card**, a popup message appears to warn you that formatting the microSD card will erase its contents.
- Touch Format SD card to confirm.

6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.



The functions below may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that came along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- Drag down the Notification panel and touch $\stackrel{\text{\tiny Def}}{\longleftrightarrow}$ then the Settings icon O to access **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Mark\unmark the checkbox of **USB tethering** to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- Drag down the Notification panel and touch $\stackrel{\text{a.i.}}{\longleftrightarrow}$ then the Settings icon O to access **Settings**.
- Touch More....\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Touch the switch **w**o beside **Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate/deactivate this function.

To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you can change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Drag down the Notification panel and touch A: then the Settings icon to access **Settings**. Drag down the Notification panel and touch then the Settings icon to access **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot\Wi-Fi hotspot.
- Touch Set up Wi-Fi hotspot to change the network SSID or set your network security.
- Touch Save.

6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More....\VPN settings and then touch 🕂.
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More...\VPN settings.
- \bullet VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch Connect.

To disconnect:

• Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for VPN disconnection.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More....\VPN settings.
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch & hold the VPN you want to edit.
- Touch Edit profile.
- After finishing, touch Save.

To delete:

• Touch and hold the VPN you want to delete, in the dialog that opens, touch **Delete profile**.

7 Google Play Store⁽¹⁾......

Google Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android powered phone.

To open Google Play Store:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch Play Store.
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention, touch Accept to continue.

Touch = and then select **Help** to enter the Google Play Store help page for more information on this function.

7.1 Locate the item you want to download and install

Google Play Store home page provides several ways to find applications. It showcases applications and games in categorized listings.

Touch the top right corner and select My apps to see all your downloads.



Touch a category to browse its contents. You can also select a subcategory if there is one. Within each category you can select to view items sorted by Top paid, Top free, Top grossing, etc

7.2 Download and install

To download and install:

- Navigate to the item you want to download, and enter the details screen from which you can read its description, overall rating or comments, view developer's information, etc.
- Touch **INSTALL** to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch ACCEPT to download.
- The progress of the download will show on the details screen, touch **STOP** to stop downloading the item. You can also access this screen through the Notification panel.
- After download and installation have finished, you will see a notification icon 😰 on the status bar.
- Be especially cautious with applications that have access to many functions or to a significant amount of your data. Once you accept, you are responsible for the results of using this item on your phone.

To open the application you have downloaded:

- On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch the top right corner and select **My apps**.
- Touch the installed application in the list, then touch **OPEN**.

To buy an application⁽¹⁾

On **Google Play Store**, some applications are labelled as free, while some of them are to be paid for before downloading and installing.

- Touch the application you want to buy.
- Touch the price to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch Continue to confirm.
- When making your first purchase, you are required to input your credit card information and to log into the Google payment and billing service.
- If your account has multiple credit card accounts, select one to proceed.
- Select the Terms of service link and read the document. When finished, touch the **Back** key.
- Mark the checkbox if you agree with the terms of service.
- Touch **Buy now** at the bottom of the screen.

When finished, Android downloads the application.

To request a refund

If you are not satisfied with the application, you can ask for a refund within 15 minutes of the purchase. Your credit card will not be charged and the application will be removed. If you change your mind, you can install the application again, but you will not be able to request a refund.

- Touch the top right corner and touch **My apps** from the Google Play Store Apps screen.
- Touch the application that you want to uninstall and refund.
- Touch **REFUND** to uninstall the application and receive a refund. If the button becomes **UNINSTALL**, your trial period has expired.
- \bullet In the survey form, select the answer that best matches your reason, and touch OK.

On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch the top right corner and touch **My apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall to enter the details screen, touch **UNINSTALL**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

Refund

On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch the top right corner and touch **My apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall for a refund, touch **REFUND**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

Update notification

On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch the top right corner and touch **Settings****Notifications** to enable update notification.

Auto update

To auto update all installed applications, touch the top right corner from the My apps screen, and then touch Settings\Auto-update apps to enable this function.

To auto update one specific application, touch the top right corner and mark the checkbox of **Auto-update** from the app details screen.

Rate and review

Open the details screen for an application, touch the stars besides Rate & review to award and input comments, touch OK to confirm.

Flag

You can report an inappropriate application to Google Play Store by flagging it. Open the details screen for the application, scroll to the bottom and touch Flag as inappropriate, enter the reason and finally touch Submit.

Multimedia applications

8.1 Camera.....

Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera for taking photos and shooting videos

Before using the Camera, please be sure to open the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.



- -Touch to switch between front/back camera. -Touch to show settings.
- -Touch to select flash modes.
- Touch the screen to set focus. Double-tap or pinch two or more fingers together or spread them apart to zoom in/out.

-Slide to view pictures or videos you have taken.

Slide to switch between camera and camcorder.

Touch to take a picture.

To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary, touch the entire icon to take the picture which will then be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch the icon to start recording. Touch **11** to pause recording, touch **2** again or press the Back key to save the video.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Touch the icons below the screen to share and edit the photo or video you have taken.
- Touch the photo icon to access the Gallery.

8.1.1 Settings in framing mode

Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch the O icon to adjust a number of settings in framing mode.

Back camera shooting mode

• HDR Touch to activate high-dynamic range. Panorama Touch to switch to panorama mode. Night Touch to switch to night mode. Touch to turn on/off the full screen view. Full screen Tap shooting Touch to turn on/off tap shooting function. Shutter sound Touch to turn on/off shutter sound. Picture size Touch to select picture size. Timer Touch to select pause duration before capturing

pictures.

Front camera shooting mode

Switch to front camera, touch == to access camera settings and the following options will display for you to choose from:

- Expression (4-shot) Touch to turn on expression (4-shot) function: once four photos taken, the phone will automatically synthesize and save them as one picture.
- Tap shooting Touch to turn on/off tap shooting function.
- Shutter sound Touch to turn on/off shutter sound.
 - Touch to turn off or set duration of timer while shooting.

Timer

Touch to set Video quality.

8.2 Gallery.....

The Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Gallery**.



To view a picture/play a video

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in the Gallery.

- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will display on the screen.
- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- · Slide left/right to view previous or next pictures/videos.

Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by editing them, sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Touch \swarrow from the full-screen picture view. More options will display for you to choose from.



- Touch to go back to the picture display screen.
- Output to undo the previous modification.
- I Touch to redo the previous modification.
- O Touch to save the modified picture.

Batch operation

The Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

Open the main Gallery window or an album, touch = and select **Select album** or **Select item** to activate batch operation mode (you can also touch and hold one album/picture), then touch albums/pictures you want to work on. Touch the = icon to delete selected ones. Touch \geq to share selected ones.

You YouTube 8.3

YouTube is an online video-sharing service where the user can download, share and view videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch YouTube.



As an online video service, your phone must have a network connection to access YouTube.

All videos in YouTube are grouped into several categories, like Most Popular, Most Discussed, Featured Videos, etc.



By touching from the YouTube screen, you can set General settings and Search settings for YouTube. For details about these features, please visit the YouTube website: www.YouTube.com

8.3.1 Watch videos

Touch a video to play it. In the Playing screen, you can view information and video comments, and also browse links to related videos. You can also rate, share, label as favorite, create a new playlist, etc. from this screen.

To exit the video playing screen, touch the **Back** key to return to the video list.

Music 8.4

Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the microSD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from a computer to the microSD card using a USB cable.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch Music.

You will find four categories in which all songs are classified: Artists, Albums, Songs and Playlists. Slide left and right to view all. Touch and touch Shuffle all to shuffle all songs.

8.4.1 Playing music

Touch a song or touch **Play** from the drop-down menu to play the song.



- Touch to play the current playlist in shuffle mode (tracks are played in random order).
- 2 Touch to skip to the previous track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- 6 Touch to pause/resume playback.
- Output: Touch to skip to the next track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- S Touch to select repeat mode: Repeating all songs, Repeating current song, or Repeat is off.
- **6** Touch to show the displayed song.



While playing songs with Music, the operation of pause, play or skip is still available even if the screen is locked.

Adjust sound effects

Touch = and touch **Sound effects** from the playing screen to enable and adjust sound effects.

8.4.2 Working with playlists

Playlists allow you to conveniently organize all songs stored in the SD card.

You can create a new playlist, add a song to the list, and delete or rename a playlist.

To create a playlist

Touch **Recently added** from the Playlists screen, touch **method** and then touch **Save as playlist**, enter the name and finally touch **Save**.

To delete a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Delete**.

To rename a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Rename**. When finished, touch **Save** to confirm.

8.5 Video Player..... >

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Video player**.

Video player is a small built-in video player that lists all your videos.

Touch an item from the list to play. While playing, touch a point on the timeline to jump to and play from.

9.1 Get My Location

9.1.1 Choose a data source to decide My Location

Touch O on the Quick setting bar to get to Settings, touch Location access.

Mark the checkbox of **Access to my location**, then the **Description** Switch beside GPS satellites will be automatically on to set GPS as the My location data source.

Alternatively, mark the checkbox of **Google's location service** to set Wi-Fi and/or mobile networks as My Location data source.

9.1.2 Open Google Maps and view My Location

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Maps**. Touch the icon on the map to view **My Location**.

The map will then center on a blue dot. Your actual position is at the blue dot.



To move the map, drag the map with your finger.

To zoom in and out of a map, pinch or spread your fingers, or you can also zoom in by double-tapping a location on screen.

9.2 Search for a location

While viewing a map, touch the search icon \mathbf{Q} to activate the search function.

In the search box, enter an address, a city or a local business.

Touch the search icon to search, and in a while your search results will appear on the map as red dots. You can touch one to show a label.



9.3 Save a location

Just like bookmarking a web address on the Internet, you can star any position on the map for later use.

⁽¹⁾ It may vary depending on the app version of Maps.

9.3.1 How to star (or unstar) a location

Touch a location on a map.

Touch the address rectangle which then opens.

Touch $\overset{\star}{\underset{\rm ares}{\rm to}}$ to save the location. (Or touch $\overset{\star}{\underset{\rm ares}{\rm to}}$ to cancel the saving of that location.)



9.3.2 View a list of saved items

Touch $\stackrel{\bullet}{=}$ to view nearby saved places. Touch View all to view a list of saved places.

Touch a location in the list to view it.

9.4 Get driving, public transportation or walking directions

9.4.1 Get suggested routes for your trip

Touch the Y icon on the Maps screen.

- Touch the enter bar to edit your start point by entering an address or selecting a saved item.
- Do the same for your end point.
- To reverse directions, touch 1.
- Then select a transport mode: driving by car, using public transportation, or walking directions.

9.4.2 Preview suggested routes and decide on a route more preferable or feasible to you

You can preview each turn in your route in Navigation, Satellite, and other views.

- · Touch Start to preview your selected route.
- Touch to open Route preview, Step-by-step list, Mute/Unmute voice guidance, or Satellite view. Touch the Back key to return to the previous view.

When selecting a more preferable or feasible route, distance and time will be the two most important factors for your evaluation. Distance and estimated time will be displayed at the bottom of the directions screen.

9.4.3 Search for locations along your route

Please refer to "9.2 Search for a location" for detailed information.

9.5 Arrangement of Layers

Layers allow you to view locations and additional information overlaid on the map. You can add multiple layers or remove only certain layers so you control exactly what information you want visible on the map at one time.

Others.....

10.1 File Manager.....

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **File Manager**.

File Manager works with both SD card and phone storage.

File Manager displays all data stored on both microSD card and phone storage, including applications, media files such as videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from a PC to your microSD card, you can locate the application on File Manager, then touch it to install it in your phone.

File Manager allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: create a (sub) folder, open a folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

I 0.2 Sound Recorder O.O

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Sound Recorder**.

Sound Recorder allows you to record voice/sound for seconds/hours.

10.3 Radio

Your phone is equipped with a radio⁽¹⁾. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer a visual radio service.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\textbf{Radio}}$



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.



Available options:

- Save channel Save the current tuned station to the channels list.
- Audio mode
 Listen to the radio using the loudspeaker or headset.
- Delete Delete the channel.
- Enter frequency Enter the frequency manually.
- Search Search for all available stations automatically.
- RDS settings Touch to select channel information and alternative frequency.
- Record FM Record the current channel.
- Exit Turn off the radio.

10.4 Setup Wizard

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Setup Wizard**.

Setup Wizard helps set up your phone in multiple ways: language, input method, mobile data connection, account setup and synchronization, system update, etc. This will also be performed the first time you power on your phone.

10.5 Alcatel Help

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Alcatel Help**.

Alcatel Help provides help when you have questions or need assistance when using the phone.

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your phone. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, please refer to the leaflet provided with the phone. You can also download thousands of 3rd party applications by going to Android Market on your phone.

II.I Wireless & networks

II.I.I Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi".

II.I.2 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) within a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to "6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices".

II.I.3 Call settings

For detailed instructions on call settings, please refer to "3.1.6 Call settings".

II.I.4 Data usage

To enable/disable mobile data, touch the switch.

By marking the checkbox of **Set mobile data limit**, you can then drag the limit line and the warning line according to your preferred limits. Your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of your phone's data use.

Touch 🚞 , and you can view more settings related to your data usage.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently. Please consider using a conservative limit.

11.1.5 Airplane mode

Through **More...\Airplane mode** you can simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also open Airplane mode by touching **AIRPLANE MODE** on the Quick setting bar or in phone options when you press the **Power** key.

II.I.6 VPN settings

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspends-and-resumes their device to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, please refer to "6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks".

11.1.7 Tethering & portable hotspot

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (Please refer to "6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection").

Touch to Enable 3G service or to select Network mode.

Preferences

Touch to view/edit/delete preferences.

You can select your preferred network with this menu.

Touch to share your PC internet via a USB cable when connected to PC.

II.2.I Gestures

Mark the checkbox or touch to enable the following gestures: **Turn over** to mute, **Turn over to activate**, **Shake to switch music**.

II.2.2 Sound

Use the Sound settings to configure ringtones for different events and environments.

VOLUME

- Vibrate Marking the check box makes your phone vibrate when receiving incoming calls.
- Silent mode Marking the check box silences all sounds except media & alarms.
- Ringtone, Slide to adjust the volume of ringtones, notifications and system sounds.
- Music, video, Slide to adjust the volume of music, video, games, games and other etc.

- Alarms Slide to adjust the alarm volume.

11.2.4 Status bar

Touch the **I** or switch to reveal all 3rd party application notifications which will then be shown on the top left of the status bar.

You can also touch some app icons to deactivate their notifications in the status bar.

11.2.5 Storage

Use these settings to manage your microSD card by monitoring the total and available space on your phone and your microSD card.



If a warning message comes up saying that phone memory is limited, you are required to free up space by deleting some unwanted applications, downloaded files, etc.

11.2.6 Battery management

In the battery screen you can view battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category to reveal its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use by adjusting screen brightness or screen timeout in the Display screen.

11.2.7 Applications

You use the Applications settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites and emails.

II.3 Personal

11.3.1 Location access

Use GPS satellites

Check to use your phone's global positioning system (GPS) satellite receiver to pinpoint your location within an accuracy as close as several meters ("street level"). The process of accessing the GPS satellite and setting your phone's precise location for the first time will require up to 5 minutes. You will need to stand in a place with a clear view of the sky and avoid moving. After this, GPS will only need 20-40 seconds to identify your precise location.

II.3.2 Security

Turn on the switch to activate this function. It will protect your privacy in case of theft or loss.

Encrypt phone

You can encrypt your accounts, settings, downloaded apps and their data, media and other files by touching Encrypt phone.

Set up SIM card lock

Choose a SIM card you want to configure.

Mark the checkbox of $\ensuremath{\text{Lock SIM}}$ card to lock the SIM card with a PIN code.

Touch Change SIM PIN to change the PIN code.

Make passwords visible

Mark the checkbox to show passwords as you type.

Device administrators

Touch to view or deactivate device administrators.

Unknown sources

Mark the checkbox to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites, emails, or other locations other than Android Market.

To protect your phone and personal data, download applications only from trusted sources, such as Android Market.

Verify apps

Mark the checkbox to prevent or warn you before installing apps which might cause harm.

Trusted credentials

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

Install from SD card

Touch to install encrypted certificates from the microSD card.

Clear credentials

Touch to remove all credentials.

11.3.3 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.

Spell checker

Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

Personal dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

Default

Touch to select a default input method. Touch the Settings icon O on the right of selected input method, a series of settings are available for your selection.

Swype

• Select Input Method

Touch to select method as English or Swype.

How to Swype

Touch to view how to use Swype.

• Personal dictionary

Touch to add and keep new words into dictionary.

Preferences

Audio feedback

Mark the checkbox to turn on sounds when tying.

Vibrate on keypress

Mark the checkbox to vibrate when keypressing.

Show tips

Mark the checkbox to turn on helpful tips from Swype.

Auto-spacing

Mark the checkbox to automatically insert spaces between words.

Auto-capitalization

Mark the checkbox to automatically capitalize the first letter in a sentence.

Show complete trace

Mark the checkbox to display the complete Swype path.

Word suggestion

Mark the checkbox to suggest words during typing.

Speed vs. accuracy

Select how quickly Swype responds to input.

Reset Swype's dictionary

Delete all the words you've added to Swype's dictionary.

Version

View the version of Swype.

Language Options

Select input language such as French, English, Spanish, etc.

Voice search

Touch to view settings about voice search, such as Language, Speech output, etc.

Text-to-speech output

Preferred engine

Touch to choose a preferred text-to-speech engine, touch the Settings icon O to show more choices for each engine.

• Speech rate

Touch to open a dialog where you can select how quickly you want the synthesizer to speak.

• Listen to an example

Touch to play a brief sample of the speech synthesizer, using your current settings.

Pointer speed

Touch to open a dialog where you can change the pointer speed. Touch \mathbf{OK} to confirm.

11.3.4 Backup and reset

Back up my data

Mark the checkbox to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers, with your Google account. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up are restored onto the new phone the first time you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings configured within the Settings application. If you unmark this option, settings are no longer backed up, and any existing backups are deleted from Google servers.

Back up account

Touch to back up your account.

Automatic restore

Mark the checkbox to restore your backed up settings or other data when you reinstall an application.

DRM reset

Touch to delete all DRM licenses.

Factory data reset

Phone reset will erase all of your personal data from the internal phone storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the phone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded or any files on your microSD card. If you reset the phone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your phone, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key simultaneously until the screen lights up.

II.4 Accounts

Use these settings to add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use them to control details of the ways applications send, receive, and synchronize data; if this is according to their own schedules; and whether all applications can synchronize user data automatically.

Touch to add an account for a selected app.

II.5. Date & time

Use Date & Time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

Automatic date & time

Touch to select Use network/GPS provided time or Off.

Mark the checkbox to use network-provided time or use GPS provided time.

Automatic time zone

Mark the checkbox to use the network-provided time zone. Or unmark to set all values manually.

Set date

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the phone's date.

Set time

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the phone's time.

Select time zone

Touch to open a dialog where you can set the phone's time zone.

Use 24-hour format Mark the checkbox to display the time using 24-hour clock format.

Select date format

Touch to open a dialog where you can select the format for displaying dates.

NTP sever

Touch to select NTP server for time auto update settings.

11.5.2 Schedule power on/off

Touch to preset the power on/off time and repeat mode.

II.5.3 Accessibility

Accessibility settings can be used to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

TalkBack

Touch to turn on/off TalkBack.

Magnification gestures

Touch to turn on/off and to activate/deactivate the zoom in/out function by triple-tapping the screen.

Power button ends call

Mark the checkbox to end a call by pressing **Power** key during the call.

Speak passwords

Mark the checkbox to speak passwords while typing.

Accessibility shortcut

Touch to turn on/off to enable/disable accessibility features.

Touch & hold delay

Touch to adjust the duration of touch and hold delay. This function enables your phone to differentiate between touch and touch & hold, which may avoid incorrect operations.

Enhance web accessibility

Touch to open a dialog which asks you to install scripts from Google which make their web content more accessible. Touch **Allow** to confirm.

11.5.4 Developer options

To access this function, touch **Settings\About phone**, then touch **Build number** 7 times. Now **Developer options** is available.

The Development screen contains settings that are useful for developing Android applications. For full information, including documentation of the Android applications and development tools, see the Android developer website (http://developer.android.com).

Desktop backup password

Touch to set/change/remove desktop full backup password.

Stay awake

Mark the checkbox to prevent the screen from dimming and locking when the phone is connected to a charger or to a USB device that provides power. Don't use this setting with a static image on the phone for long periods of time, or the screen may be marked with that image.

Protect SD card

Mark the checkbox to select that apps must request permission to read your SD card.

USB debugging

Mark the checkbox to permit debugging tools on a computer to communicate with your phone via a USB connection.

Power menu bug report

Mark the checkbox to include the option of submitting a bug report in the power menu.

Allow mock locations

Mark the checkbox to permit a development tool on a computer to control where the phone believes it is located, rather than using the phone's own internal tools for this purpose.

Select debug app

Touch to select debug app.

Wait for debugger
