User Guide

1. The Basics Front View of Phone



Key Features

- 1. Earpiece: Lets you hear the caller's voice.
- 2. Main LCD (display): Displays the phone's main menu, features, modes, etc.
- **3. Softkey (left):** Lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom left line on the Main LCD.
- **4.** Navigation Key: Lets you navigate quickly and easily through the menu options. You can access the menu shortcuts by pressing **Right**: Contacts, **Left**: Shortcut, **Up**: Messaging, and **Down**: Downloads.

- **5. MENU/OK:** Lets you access the phone's menus and select menu options.
- 6. Web Key: Lets you launch the Browser.
- 7. TALK Key: Lets you place or receive calls, answer Call Waiting, or use Three-Way Calling.
- 8. Microphone: To speak into or record your voice.
- **9.** Accessories Connector: Connects accessories such as a travel charger (included) and USB cable (not included).
- **10. Keypad:** Lets you enter numbers, letters, and characters, and navigate within menus. Press and hold keys 2-9 for speed dialing.
- **11. SPEAKER Key:** Lets you place or receive calls in speakerphone mode.
- **12. END/POWER Key:** Lets you turn the phone on/off, end a call, or return to standby mode.
- **13. BACK Key**: Lets you display the previous page or clear characters from the screen.
- **14. Softkey (right):** Lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom right line on the Main LCD.
- **15. Speaker:** Lets you hear the different ringers and sounds. You can mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls by pressing (MNDO), (are), or the Side Up/Down Key. Also lets you hear the caller's voice in speakerphone mode.
- **16. Sub LCD:** Lets you monitor the phone's status and see who's calling without opening the phone.
- **17. LED Indicator:** Shows your phone's connection status at a glance.
- 18. Antenna: Fully extend the antenna for the best reception.
- **19. Headset Jack:** Allows you to attach an optional phone headset for hands-free phone use. (For Monaural Headset Only.)
- **20. 10-4 Button:** Allows you to access the 10-4 List. (See "Displaying the 10-4 List" on page 93.)
- **21. Side Up/Down Key:** Lets you adjust the receiver volume during a call or ringer volume in standby mode. Press and hold to make a voice dial or redial with the flip closed.

Viewing the Display Screen

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your display screen.

- ► ¶ull shows your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.
- ▶ 次 means your phone cannot find a signal.
- Gindicates a call is on hold.
- C tells you a call is in progress.
- ▶ III indicates the 1X Services/10-4 access are available.
- ▶ I indicates the 1X Services/10-4 access are not available.
- Image: indicates 1X Services/10-4 access are connected, but voice calls can be sent or received.
- ▶ **1** indicates 1X Services/10-4 access are active.
- ▶ ☐ indicates you have new text messages waiting.
- ► Indicates you have new voicemail messages waiting. Press and hold 1 to call your voicemail box.
- ► Tindicates you have text messages and voicemail messages waiting.
- ▶ 🖪 indicates you are roaming on digital service network.
- ▶ III indicates you are roaming on analog service network.
- ▶ 🗿 indicates your phone is on analog service network.
- ▶ 😹 indicates the 10-4 service is unavailable.
- indicates the 10-4 service is enabled and the speakerphone mode is set to on.
- ▶ I shows the level of your battery charge. The more black you see, the more power you have left. It turns I while charging.
- • indicates you have menus to scroll (in four directions).

- ► 📲 indicates the vibrate feature is set to ON.
- ► ₩ indicates volume level 4 and vibrate feature is set to ON.

Turning Your Phone ON and OFF

Turning Your Phone ON

► To turn your phone on, press END/0.

Once your phone is ON, it displays "Looking for service..." which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to save your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

Turning Your Phone OFF

Press and hold more until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.


Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

Using the Battery

Installing the Battery

To install the Lilon battery:

- **1.** Insert the battery into the opening on the back of the phone and gently press down.
- **2.** Place the battery cover into the position as indicated in the diagram, then slide it until you hear it snap into place.



Removing the Battery

To remove your battery:

- **1.** Make sure the power is off. Press the battery release latch, then slide the battery cover and remove it.
- **2.** Use your thumbnail to lift and then remove the battery as indicated in the diagram.





Charging the Battery

Your phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon appears and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use an approved travel charger or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, and browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Using the Travel Charger

To use the travel charger provided with your phone:

- **1.** Plug the travel charger into a wall outlet.
- **2.** Plug the other end of the travel charger into the side of your phone (with the battery installed).

Charging when your phone is turned on:

The battery icon **G** appears on the display while charging. The battery icon turns to **m** when charging is complete.

Charging when your phone is turned off:

The battery icon appears, and the message "BATTERY CHARGING-Power Off-" is shown on the display while charging. When the battery is completely discharged, you may wait for several minutes until the message is shown on the display. The battery icon turns to III, and message changes to "CHARGING COMPLETE-Power Off-" when charging is complete.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

Displaying Your Phone Number

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Contacts** and press **(B)**.
- **3.** Highlight **My Phone#** and press **(B)**.

Note: To access the phone's main menu, press () from standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the navigation key and pressing), or you can press the number corresponding to the menu item on your keypad.

Making and Answering Calls


Making Calls

To place a call using your keypad:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- **2.** Enter a phone number. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press are to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold are to erase the entire number.)
- 3. Press TALK or SPEAKER.
- 4. When you're finished, press (ND/O).

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press **TALK** or **SPEAKER** twice.

Important: When you use your phone to maximize performance, extend the antenna and do not touch the antenna.



To place a call with the flip closed:

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on.
- **2**. Press and hold **Contract** on the left side of the phone.
- **3.** Follow the system prompts. (The call will be made in speakerphone mode, unless you have a headset attached to the phone.)
- **Redial** to redial the last number you called.
- ► Voice Dial to use the Voice Dial function (see "Using Voice-Activated Dialing" on page 84).

Tip: This function is available only when the Side Key Guard setting is off. See page 47 for the Side Key Guard.

Note: To use a Voice Dial, you must have stored Voice Dial entries (see "Programming Voice Dial Tag to Your Phone" on page 84).

Dialing Options

Dialing options are displayed when you press **Options** (right softkey) after entering numbers in the standby mode.

To select an option, highlight it and press 🐨.

- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- ► Send Text to send a text message (mobile numbers only). (See "Sending a Message" on page 112.)
- ► Save Phone# to save the phone number in your Contacts list. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 18.)
- ► Find to display Contacts list entries that end with the digits you entered. (See "Finding a Phone Number" on page 19.)
- ► Hard Pause to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 19.)
- ► **2-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 19.)
- **Hyphen** to insert a hyphen manually where you like.

Tip: To Speed Dial a phone number, press and hold the appropriate Speed Dial location from 2-9. See page 63 for setting.

Answering Calls

To answer an incoming call with the flip open:

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on. If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.
- **2.** Press **TALK** or **GRACE** to answer an incoming call. (Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any number key. See "Setting Any Key Answer" on page 40 for more information.)

To answer an incoming call with the flip closed:

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.)
- **2.** When your phone rings or vibrates, press and hold the Side Call key (**1111**) on the left side of the phone. (The call will be answered in speakerphone mode.)

- or -

Open the phone to use the earpiece.

Note: If the setting for Open Flip is not set to **Answer Call**, opening the phone will not answer the call. (See "Setting the Open/Close Flip Option" on page 46.)

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- ▶ The phone rings or vibrates.
- ▶ The LED flashes.
- ► The backlight illuminates.
- ▶ The screen displays an incoming call message.
- ▶ If available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.
- If the phone number is in your Contacts list, the contact's name is displayed.

The following options are also displayed by pressing **Options** (right softkey).

To select an option, highlight it and press 🐨.

- **Answer** to answer the call.
- **Answer:Speaker** to answer the call in speakerphone mode.
- Answer on Hold to put the call on hold. (See "Setting Answer on Hold" on the next page.)
- ► Screen Call to answer the call by using pre-recorded announcement. (This feature appears when you are in service area or digital roaming area.) See page 89 for setting up.
- Quiet Ringer to mute the ringer. (This feature appears when the ringer is set.)

Note: If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.

Setting Answer on Hold

This feature allows you to hold an incoming call when you cannot answer immediately.

To set Answer on Hold:

- **1.** When you receive an incoming call, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Answer on Hold and press . (The caller hears a message to wait for you to answer. If will display on the screen while the call is on hold.)

To resume the call:

▶ Press Answer (left softkey) or TALK.

- or -

Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Answer** or **Answer:Speaker** and press **(P)**.

Note: Answer on Hold is not available in analog areas.

Ending a Call

► Close the phone or press END/0.

Note: If the setting for Close Flip is not set to **End Call**, closing the phone will not end the call. (See "Setting the Open/Close Flip Option" on page 46.)

Tip: Time/Date is displayed when you press while the phone is in use.

Using the Speakerphone

The speakerphone feature lets you hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding the phone. When the speakerphone is activated, use the Side Up/Down key or press the navigation key up or down to adjust the volume.

To turn the speakerphone on during a call:

- or -

Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Speaker On**, and press **(P)**.

To turn the speakerphone off during a call:

Press SPEAKER.

- or -

Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Speaker Off**, and press **(Press)**.

Changing the Ringer Volume

To change the ringer volume, adjust the Side Up/Down key when the phone is in standby mode.

Note: To change the ringer volume from the main menu, see "Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings" on page 28.

Adjusting Volume During a Conversation

Whether you need to hear more or less of a conversation, adjust the Side Up/Down key or press the navigation key up or down during a call.

Muting a Call

To mute a call:

Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Mute**, and press **(When the phone is muted, "Mute**" appears on the display.)

To unmute a call:

▶ Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Unmute**, and press **\$\$**.

Tip: To use this feature with the flip closed, press and hold **Content** (located on the side of your phone).

Displaying the Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, your phone displays the Missed Call Notification.

Press View (left softkey). (To call an entry, highlight the entry you want to call and press TALK or GPEAKED.)

Calling Emergency Numbers

To select an option, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight it, and press **®**.

Options:

- ► **Speaker On** to activate speakerphone mode. (If you are in speakerphone mode, the option will appear as **Speaker Off** to deactivate.)
- ► **Unlock Phone** to unlock your phone (appears only if the phone is locked).
- Close Menu to close the pop-up menu (appears only if the phone is unlocked).

Tip: Press **My Phone** (left softkey) to display your phone number during Emergency mode.

To exit Emergency mode:

- 1. Press END/O.
- **2**. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 3. Highlight Exit Emergency and press 🐨.

Note: When you are in Emergency mode, you can only exit from the options menu.

To select Emergency mode options:

- **1.** Press **END/O** during a 911 call.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- Call 911 to call 911.
- **Call 911:Speaker** to call 911 in speakerphone mode.
- **Exit Emergency** to exit Emergency mode.
- 3. Select an option and press 🐨.

In-Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options by pressing **Options** (right softkey).

To select an option, highlight it and press 🐨.

- ► **Flash** to answer an incoming Call Waiting call or connect a third party during Three-Way Calling.
- Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select Unmute to reactivate the microphone.
- ► Speaker On or Speaker Off to activate or deactivate speakerphone mode. You can adjust the speakerphone volume using the Side Up/Down key.

Warning! Due to higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

- **Three -Way Call** to call a third party.
- **Call History** to access the Call History menu. (See "Managing Call History" on page 56.)
- Contacts to access the Contacts menu. (See "Contacts Directory" on page 59.)
- Messaging to access the Messaging menu. (See "Messaging" on page 110.)
- Settings to access the Settings menu. (See "Your Phone's Settings" on page 25.)
- ▶ **Tools/Extras** to access the Tools/Extras menu. (See Calendar menu instructions on page 67.)

Note: Flash menu appears in Call Waiting and Three-Way Call. Mute menu does not appear during a 911 call.

End-of-Call Options

To display the following options, press **Options** (right softkey) within 10 seconds after disconnecting a call.

To select an option, highlight it and press 🐨.

- Call Again to dial the phone number.
- Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- Save Phone# to save the phone number in your Contacts list.
 Go to Phone Book appears when the number is already in your Contacts list. (See "Saving a Phone Number" below.)

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

Saving a Phone Number

Your phone can store up to seven phone numbers in each of 300 Contact entries with up to 500 total numbers. Each entry's name can contain 16 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Contacts entries alphabetically.

- 1. Enter a phone number.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press 🐨.
- 4. Select a label by highlighting Mobile, Home, Work, Pager, Fax, Other, or No Label and press .
- 5. Enter a Name and press .Once you have stored an entry in Contacts list, you are prompted to select the following entry modes:
- New Name to enter a name directly.
- **From Ph. Book** to select a name from the Contacts entry list.
- 6. Press Save (left softkey).

Finding a Phone Number

You can search Contacts list entries for phone numbers that contain a specific string of numbers.

- Enter the last four or more digits of the number and press
 Options (right softkey). The more numbers you enter, the more specific the search becomes.
- 2. Highlight **Find** and press (19). The Contacts entry that ends with the digits you entered appears.
- **3.** Highlight your desired entry. Press to display the entry details. Press **TALK** or **SPEAKED** to dial.

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- ► Hard Pause sends the next set of numbers when you press TALK.
- 2-Sec. Pause automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

- 1. Enter the phone number and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight either **Hard Pause** or **2-Sec. Pause** and press **.** Hard Pauses are displayed as a "H" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- **4.** To dial the number, press **TALK** or **SPEARED**. (When dialing a number with a hard pause, press **TALK** to send the next set of numbers.)

To save the number in your Contacts list, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Save Phone#**, and press **(Phone Phone Ph**

Dialing From the Contacts Directory

- **1.** Press **(1)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Contacts and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Find/Add Entry and press 🐨.

Shortcut: Press the navigation key right to list entries.

- **4.** Use your navigation key to scroll through the Contacts list and highlight one of the appropriate entries and press .
- 5. Highlight the number you wish to call.
- **6.** Press **Options** (right softkey) for the menu options.
- 7. Highlight Call or Call:Speaker On and press 🐨.

Tip: You can also make a call by pressing TALK, SPEACED, or Call (left softkey) during step 5 above.

Note: The icon next to each entry represent the Contacts labels (for example, Mobile, Home, Work, etc.). A triangle next to an icon means there is another number for the entry. Press the navigation key right or left to select the desired label/number.

Using One-Touch Speed Dialing

With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9. (See page 63 for storing a Speed Dial number.)

To use speed dial for voice calls:

- From standby mode, press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds.
 - or -

From standby mode, press the appropriate key and press TALK or GREAKED.

The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Connecting...".

To use speed dial for 10-4 calls:

The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "10-4 calling...".

Selecting a Character Input Mode

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding a Contacts entry or when sending Email messages).

- **1.** When you display a screen where you can enter text, press **Mode** (right softkey).
- 2. Select a character input mode, highlight it and press 🐨.
- Add Word to store words that you use frequently.
- Canned Messages to enter canned messages. (For Text Message only.)
- Recent Messages to enter messages you have used recently. (For Text Message only.)
- **Signature** to enter your signature. (For Text Message only.)
- ► **T9 Word** to enter characters using T9 Text Input (see next page).
- Alphabet to enter characters by tapping the keypad.
- **SYMBOL** to enter symbols.
- **NUMBER** to enter numbers.
- PRESET SUFFIX to enter a preset suffix.
- **SMILEYS** to enter smiley pictures.
- **Emoticons** to enter an emotion icon. (For Text Message only.)
- **Select Language** to select the language (English or French).
- **Erase All** to erase all text (if applicable).
- ▶ **Paste** to paste copied or cut text (if applicable).
- Select Text to select stored text for copying or cutting.

Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the **T9Word** mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on the previous page.)

T9 Text Input analyses the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) To accept a word and insert a space, press **Suce P**.

If you make a mistake, press **EACK** to erase a single character. Press and hold **EACK** to delete a word.

Adding a Word to the T9 Database

If a word you want to enter does not display as an option when you are using T9 Text Input, you can add it to the database.

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Others and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Text Entry** and press **(B)**.
- 5. Highlight Add Word and press 🐨.
- **6.** Enter the word using multi-tap (Alphabet) text entry and press **Save** (left softkey).

Tip: To confirm the words you have added, select **My Words** and press region of the state of the select the select **My Words** and press regions are selected as the selected of the selected o

Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the **Alphabet** mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 22). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.

After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character not on the same key.

Tip: The beginning of the word after the space is changed to upper/lower case depending on shift mode. You can change the shift mode by pressing SMRN.

Reminder: To access the phone's main menu, press (B) from standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the navigation key and pressing (B).

Sound Settings

Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls

Select a ringer type for voice calls so that you can recognize when a certain type of call is coming in:

To select a ringer type for voice calls:

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Sounds and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Ringer Type** and press **(BP)**.
- 5. Highlight Voice Calls and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight With Caller ID or No Caller ID and press 🐨.
- 7. Highlight your desired ringer type and press 🐨.

To select a distinctive ringer for voice calls while roaming:

- 1. Follow steps 1-5 above.
- 2. Highlight Roaming and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight **Distinctive** and press **(BP)**.
- ► To confirm the ringer, press **Play** (right softkey).
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Normal** during step 3 above.

Note: The Normal ringer is available only when you are in digital roaming area.

Selecting Ringer Types for 10-4 Calls

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- **3**. Highlight **Sounds** and press **(B)**.
- 4. Highlight **Ringer Type** and press **(Provide State 1999)**.
- 5. Highlight 10-4 and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight 10-4 Calls, 10-4 Missed, or 10-4 Floor Tone, and press 🌚.
- 7. Select your desired menu, and press 🌚.

Selecting Ringer Types for Voicemail

- 1. Press 🌚 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- **3.** Highlight **Sounds** and press **(B)**.
- 4. Highlight **Ringer Type** and press **(1997)**.
- 5. Highlight Voicemail and press 🐨.
- 6. Press 🐨, select your desired menu, and press 🐨.

Selecting Ringer Types for Messages

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- **3.** Highlight **Sounds** and press **(B)**.

- Voicemail sets an alert to notify you of caller's message(s).
 Select Ringer Length to set the ringer length of Voicemail notification.
- **Messaging** sets an alert to notify you of text message(s). Select **Ringer Length** to set the ringer length of Messaging notification.
- Minute Beep sets a minute reminder that beeps ten seconds before the end of each minute during a call.
- **Signal Fade** sets alert to notify you when your phone loses a signal during a call.

To set the alerts:

- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- **3.** Highlight **Sounds** and press **(B)**.
- 4. Highlight Alerts and press 🐨.

Your phone is equipped with a Location feature which will allow the network to detect your position, making some Applications easier to use. Turning Location off will hide your location from everyone except 911.

Note: Even if the Location feature is enabled, no service may use your location without your expressed permission.

Tip: When the Location feature is on, your phone's standby screen will display the \bigoplus icon. When Location is turned off, the \bigoplus icon will be displayed.



A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate via a telephone.

Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press .
- 3. Highlight Others and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **TTY** and press **(**You will see a message on the display.)
- 5. Press 🐨 or 🛛 K (left softkey) to continue.
- 6. Select Enable or Disable and press 🐨.

Note: When you connect TTY devices, your phone will display \blacksquare in TTY mode.

Note: If TTY mode is enabled, the audio quality of non-TTY devices connected to the headset jack may be impaired.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: 911 Emergency Calling

It is recommended that TTY users make emergency calls by other means including cellular and landline communications.

Airplane Mode

When your phone is in Airplane mode, it cannot send or receive any calls (except for 911 dialing) or access online information. You may still use the phone's other features, such as Voice Memo, Calculator, Calendar, etc., while you are in Airplane mode.

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Others and press 🐨.
- **4.** Highlight **Airplane Mode** and press **(**You will see a message on the display.)
- 5. Press rot **OK** (left softkey).

Note: While in Airplane mode, your phone's standby screen will display "Phone Off."

My Shortcut

- 5. Highlight Car Kit/Headset or Speakerphone and press 🐨.

- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 6 above.

Setting Any Key Answer

This feature allows you to answer incoming calls by pressing any key (except (NDD), and, softkeys, and sidekeys).

- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press **(B)**.
- 4. Highlight Any Key Answer and press 🐨.
- 5. Select On and press 🐨.
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

Headset Mode

This feature allows you hands-free phone use. Set the headset mode to Voice Call or 10-4 and press the Turbo Button (the operation button) on the headset to activate useful functions.

To connect the headset:

▶ Simply plug the headset into your phone's headset jack.

To set headset mode:

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Others and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Headset Mode and press 🐨.

This feature helps conserve your battery power by restricting the display.

- 4. Highlight Sleep Mode and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight your desired option and press 🐨.
- ► To deactivate this feature, highlight **Off** during step 5 above.

Setting Message Notification

You can see an icon or an icon and message notification when you receive a text message or Voicemail.

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight **Messaging** and press **(B)**.
- 4. Highlight Notification and press 🐨.
- 5. Select Msgs and lcon or lcon Only and press 🐨.

Setting Push Options

This feature allows you to connect Web Alerts page automatically if possible when you receive. See page 121 for Web Alerts.

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Push Options** and press **(19)**.
- 5. Select Yes and press 🐨.
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **No** during step 5 above.

Editing Canned Messages

Your phone can store canned messages for use with text messaging. You can edit your phone's default canned messages through the Settings menu.

To edit a canned message:

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Canned Msgs and press 🐨.
- 5. Select the message you want to edit and press 🐨.
- ► To reset all messages, press **Options** (right softkey), select **Reset All Msgs**, and press **W** during step 5 above.
- 6. Use your keypad to edit the message and press **OK** (left softkey) or **W** to save your changes. ("Canned Msgs Saved" will display.)

To change the language of the canned messages:

- 3. Select English or French.

Note: For information on editing text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 22.

- Mute to continue the call. Your voice is muted, however you can hear the caller's voice from the speaker.

- 2. Highlight Lock Now or On Power-up and press 🐨.

- ► **Full Lock:** All phone calls except for emergency number, Customer Service, or special numbers cannot be made. No phone calls can be received except for special numbers.
- Excp. Incom.Calls: All phone calls except for emergency number, Customer Service or special numbers cannot be made, but all incoming calls can be received.

Tip: If you want to cancel the "On Power-up" setting before turning the phone off, select **Unlocked** during step 2 above.

Unlocking Your Phone

- 4. Highlight Locked and press 🐨.

You can restrict phone numbers your phone dials or receives. (The Restrict Calls setting does not apply to 911 or Customer Service.)

- 2. Highlight Limit Use and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight **Outgoing Calls** or **Incoming Calls** and press **(**
- 4. Highlight your desired option and press 🐨.

Options:

- Allow All: You can make or receive all calls.
- Phone Book Only: Only Contacts entries, Voicemail or special numbers (see below) are available to make or receive calls.
- Special #s Only: Only three special numbers are available to make or receive calls.

Note: Restricted incoming calls are forwarded to voicemail.

Using Special Numbers

You can save three special numbers in addition to your Contacts entries (the same number may be in both directories). You can make and receive calls from special numbers even when your phone is locked.

To add or replace a special number:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 48), highlight **Others** and press **(P)**.
- 2. Highlight Special #s and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight the box under the entry number and press 🐨.

Erasing the Contacts Directory

Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the home network and whether your phone is operating in analog or digital mode. The following chart indicates what you'll see depending on where you're using your phone.

Roaming on Digital Networks

When you're roaming on digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the home network. You may not be able to access certain features, such as Web.

Roaming on Analog Networks

When you roam on analog networks, you will experience a similar quality provided by other analog carriers today. Although some features, such as Web, will be unavailable, you can still make and receive calls. You will experience a few differences:

- You are more likely to experience cross-talk, fade-out, and dropped calls.
- Some features which are standard on the home network are unavailable.
- There are security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analog services today.
- Your battery needs recharging sooner when you use your phone for analog roaming.

Note: If you're on a call when you leave the home network and enter an area where roaming is available (whether digital or analog), your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the home network.

Note: When using your phone in analog mode, the handset may feel warm. This behaviour is normal for analog operation.

Setting Your Phone's Roam Mode

Your phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the **Roaming** menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts.

Set Mode

Choose from four different settings on your dual band/tri mode phone to control your roaming experience:

- 1. Press 🏶 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Roaming and press 🐨.
- 4. To select an option, select it and press 🐨.
- Automatic: This setting seeks Service. When Service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
- Home Only: This setting allows you to access the home network only and prevents roaming on other networks.
- **Digital Only:** This setting forces the phone to seek a digital roaming system.
- Analog Only: This setting forces the phone to seek an analog roaming system.

6. Managing Call History

Viewing History

You'll find the Call History feature very helpful. It is a list of the last 20 phone numbers (or Contacts entries) for each calls that you placed, accepted, or missed. Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.

- 1. Press 🌚 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Call History and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed and press 🐨.

Tip: You can switch the Voice Call history to the 10-4 call history by pressing **10-4** (left softkey). To return to the Voice Call history, press **Voice Call** (left softkey).

Call History Options

For additional information and options on a particular call, highlight a Call History entry and press **Options** (right softkey).

- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- Send Text to send a text message. See page 112 for details.
- Save Phone# to save the phone number (if applicable). If the caller's phone number is already saved in your Contacts list, Go to Phone Book appears. (See "Saving a Phone Number From Call History" on the next page.)
- Prepend to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number. (See "Prepending a Phone Number From Call History" on page 58.)
- **Copy to Personal** to copy the phone number to the 10-4 Personal List. (Only appears when 10-4 mode is set to Enable and the number does not match any stored entry in your Personal List.)
- **Erase** to erase the entry.

Making a Call From Call History

- 3. Highlight Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed and press 🐨.

Saving a Phone Number From Call History

- 4. Highlight the call history entry you want to save.
- **5.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.

- **7.** Highlight the appropriate label (Mobile, Home, Work, Pager, Fax, Other, or No Label) and press **(19)**.
- 8. Enter a name and press . Once you have stored an entry in the Contacts list, you are prompted to select from the following entry modes:
- New Name to enter a name directly.
- **From Ph. Book** to select a name from Contacts entry list.
- 9. Press Save (left softkey).

Note: You cannot save phone numbers already in your Contacts list or from calls identified as No ID or Restricted. If the selected entry has already been stored in the Contacts list, **Go to Phone Book** appears during step 3 above.

Prepending a Phone Number From Call History

If you need to make a call from Call History and you happen to be outside your local area code, you can add the appropriate prepending by following these steps:

- Phone Book to display the Contacts list.
- **Company List** to display the Company List.
- **Company Groups** to display the Company Group List.
- **Personal List** to display the Personal List.
- Personal Groups to display the Personal Group List.
- **3.** Scroll through the list and press **(**) to select your desired entry.

Note: The **Goto** (left softkey) option does not appear when 10-4 mode is set to Disable (see "Setting 10-4 Mode" on page 92).

To access Contacts options, display the entry list, highlight an entry and press , then select a phone number and press **Options** (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press .

- **Edit** to edit your desired label.
- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- **Call:Speaker On** to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- **Send Text** to send a text message. (See page 112 for details.)
- **Call Alarm** to set a call alarm to the entry (see page 70).
- Set Speed Dial to set the Speed Dial to the entry (see page 63).
- Set Voice Dial to set a Voice Dial to the entry (see page 84).
- Prepend to alter a phone number by adding numbers to the beginning of the entry. (See "Prepending a Phone Number From Call History" on page 58.)
- ► **Copy to Personal** to copy the phone number to your 10-4 Personal List. (Only appears when 10-4 mode is set to Enable and the number does not match any stored entry in your Personal List.)

Tip: You can view the next entry by pressing the navigation key right or view the previous entry by pressing the navigation key left.

Assigning Speed Dial Numbers

With this feature you can dial Contacts Directory entries with one key press for locations 2-9. Save your memory locations 2-9 for speed dialing your most commonly used phone numbers. Speed Dial numbers must be stored in your Contacts to use this feature.

To set Speed Dial:

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Contacts** and press **(BP)**.
- 3. Highlight Speed Dial #s and press 🐨.
- **4.** To select a corresponding speed dial number from 2-9, highlight an unassigned number and press **.**
- 5. Select an entry from the list and press 🐨.
- **6.** Select the phone number you want to set as a speed dial and press **(B)**.
- ► When you highlight an assigned number and press , you'll be asked whether you want to overwrite the assigned number. Select **Yes** to overwrite or **No** to cancel.

To use Speed Dial:

▶ From standby mode, just press and hold the appropriate key.

Editing a Contacts Entry

Erasing a Contacts Entry From the List

Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry

You can assign a ringer/image type to a Contacts entry so you can identify the caller by the ringer or image type.

To select a ringer type for an entry:

- ► To confirm the ringer, highlight **Ringer** and press **Play** (right softkey).

To select an image type for an entry:

- 3. Select a menu by scrolling up or down and press 🐨.

- ► To see a display preview of an image, press **Preview** (right softkey) during step 4 above.
- ► If you set an animation ringer (indicated with micron) and an image, your phone plays the ringer (audio) of the animation ringer and displays the image you selected.

Secret Contacts Entries

You can hide an entry's phone number(s) by making them secret, which requires your lock code to edit the entry. The entry name is still displayed, but the entry's phone numbers are replaced by "<Secret>".

- **1.** Press the navigation key right.
- 2. Scroll to the Contacts entry you want to tag Secret.
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the menu options.
- 4. Highlight Set Secret and press 🐨.
- 5. Enter the 4-digit lock code.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of your phone number, or 0000.

You must be in digital mode to access Services.

Managing Schedules

Calendar

Use the Calendar to remind you of events or important calls you need to make. You can schedule up to 100 events, 15 Call Alarms and 20 To Do Items.

Displaying Your Calendar

- 1. Press 🏶 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Calendar and press 🐨.

Note: In a no-service area or an analog service area, it's necessary to set the actual time and date to use the Calendar function after removing and installing your battery.

Setting Holidays

You can set your personal holidays by displaying the date in red on the Calendar display. The default holidays displayed in red are Sundays and National holidays.

Note: You can set holidays from Jan 1, 2000 to Dec 31, 2020.

- 1. From the Calendar display, highlight the day you want to set to the holiday by using the navigation key (Left: previous day, Right: next day, Up: previous week, Down: next week, Side Up/Down key: previous/next month).
- 2. Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Holiday**, and press **(Press)**.
- 3. Highlight Set Date or Set Weekly, and press 🐨.

Tip: The current day is framed by a rectangle.

Adding an Event to the Scheduler

- 1. From the Calendar display, highlight the day you want to add an event by using the navigation key and press .
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 3. Highlight Add Event and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Schedule** and press **(B)**.

- **From** Scheduling the start time.
- **To** Scheduling the end time.
- **Location** Editing the location of your event (up to 14 characters).
- Alarm Select the ringer you wish to set.
- Alarm Time Editing the alarm time (number of hours or minutes before the event starts). Default alarm time is 10 minutes.
- Repeat Repeating the event. Select None, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, or Yearly.
- 7. Press **Save** (left softkey) to schedule the event.

Tip: Press the navigation key up or down to scroll by week through the Scheduler calendar, and the Side Up/Down key to scroll by month.

Tip: The date you have scheduled events for is indicated by " \blacktriangleright ".

Event Alerts

There are several ways your phone alerts you of scheduled events.

- By playing the alert tone (depending on the Alert and Ringer Volume setting).
- By blinking the LED.
- By displaying the event's description on the Main LCD when the flip is open.
- By lighting the LCD backlight (depending on the backlight setting).

Event Alert Menu

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone alerts you and displays the event summary.

- 1. Press row or View (left softkey) to silence the alarm and see the event details.
- 2. Highlight the unchecked event and press rotes to see the event details, or press **Options** (right softkey) for following options. To select an option, highlight it and press **P**.
- **Snooze** to repeat the alarm in ten minutes.
- **Exit** to exit the options.

Note: If you press \underline{Exit} (left softkey) during step 2 above, you are prompted to erase the unchecked event. Select **Yes** to erase or **No** to cancel.

Viewing Events

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Calendar and press 🐨.
- 4. Select the date for which you set events and press (). (The selected day's events list will display.)

Editing an Event

- 1. From the Event list display, highlight one of the events and press .
- Select the box under each item you want to edit and press (See "Adding an Event to the Scheduler" on page 68 for options.)
- 3. Enter or select a new setting and press 🐨.
- 4. Press Save (left softkey).

Adding a Call Alarm to the Scheduler

- 1. From the Calendar display, highlight the day you want to add an event by using the navigation key and press .
- **2.** From the event list display, press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 3. Highlight Add Event and press 🐨.

Tip: You can also add a Call Alarm from the Contacts menu (see "Contacts List Entry Options" on page 62).

Call Alarm Alerts

There are several ways your phone alerts you of scheduled call alarms.

- By playing the alert tone (depending on the Alert and Ringer Volume setting).
- By blinking the LED.
- By displaying the call alarm notification on the Main LCD when the flip is open.
- By lighting the LCD backlight (depending on the backlight setting).

Call Alarm Menu

When your phone is turned on and you have scheduled a call alarm, your phone alerts you and displays the name or phone number.

- 1. Press e or View (left softkey) to silence the alarm and see the unchecked event list.
- 2. Highlight the unchecked call alarm and press (1) to see the call alarm details, or press (0) to following options. To select an option, highlight it and press (1).
- **Call** to dial the scheduled phone number.
- **Call:Speaker On** to dial the scheduled phone number in speakerphone mode.
- **Snooze** to repeat the alarm in ten minutes.
- ► Save Phone# to save the scheduled phone number in your Contacts list. Go to Phone Book appears when the number is already in your Contacts list.

Note: If you press Exit (left softkey) during step 2 above, you are prompted to erase the unchecked event. Select **Yes** to erase or **No** to cancel.

Editing a Call Alarm

- 1. From the Event list display, highlight one of the call alarms and press .
- 2. Select the box under each item you want to edit and press (See "Adding a Call Alarm to the Scheduler" on page 70 for options.)
- 3. Enter or select a new setting and press 🐨.
- 4. Press Save (left softkey).

Erasing a Day's Event or Call Alarm

- **1.** From the Event list display, highlight one of the events or call alarms and press **Options** (right softkey).

- 5. Enter the description and press 🐨 (up to 14 characters).
- 6. Highlight **Priority** and press to edit the To Do's priority. You can select from **Normal**, !**Urgent**, or √**Done**.
- 7. Press Save (left softkey).

Viewing To Do List

- **1.** From the Calendar display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight To Do List and press 🐨.
- ► To see the details of each To Do item, select an item and press ∰.

Editing To Do Items

- 1. From the To Do list display, highlight the item you want to edit and press .
- 2. Highlight the box you want to edit and press 🐨.
- 3. Edit description or change the priority and press 🐨.
- 4. Press Save (left softkey).

Adding a To Do Item to the Schedule

- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- **3.** Highlight **Alarm Clock** and press **(**A caution appears on the display.)
- 4. Press Continue (left softkey) to continue.
- 5. Highlight the box under the following items and press 🐨.
- ► Alarm to set the alarm **On/Off**. Select **On** and press **@**.
- ► Time to enter the alarm time. Enter the desired alarm time and press .
- Repeat to select the alarm frequency. Select None to set your alarm once or Daily to set your alarm daily.
- **6.** Press **Done** (left softkey) to save the alarm settings.

Note: The alarm will not sound when the phone is powered off.

To stop the alarm:

- Press any key to stop the alarm.
- Press Exit (right softkey) to exit the alarm clock display.

Tip: The alarm stops in 30 seconds automatically.

Note: You can adjust the ringer type and ringer volume in your Settings menu. To change the ringer type, see "Selecting Ringer Types for Calendar and Alarm" on page 26. To change the ringer volume, see "Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings" on page 28.

Using the Calculator

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Calculator and press 🐨.
- **4.** Enter numbers using your keypad. Press the left softkey to insert a decimal point.
- **5.** Press the appropriate navigation key for an arithmetic option. (Up for addition, Down for subtraction, Left for multiplication, Right for division)
- 6. Enter numbers and press 🐨 for the result.
- ► To clear the numbers, press **CLR** (right softkey).

Using the World Clock

This feature is available only in digital areas.

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight World Clock and press 🐨.
- 4. The World Clock display appears.
- Press the navigation key right or left for changing city or country.

Tip: Press **Summer** (left softkey) or **Standard** (right softkey) for changing between summer and standard time, if applicable. "**※**" is shown while summer time is displayed.

Using the Stop Watch

To start the stop watch:

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Stop Watch and press 🐨.
- Press Start (left softkey) to start the stop watch operation.
- ▶ Press **Stop** (left softkey) to stop the stop watch operation.
- Press Resume (left softkey) to start the stop watch operation again.

To record a lap time while the stop watch is running:

- ▶ Press Lap (right softkey) to record time of first lap.
- Press Lap (right softkey) again to record next lap. (You may continue this until lap 5.)

To display the stop watch options:

- **1.** During stop watch operation, press **Options** (right softkey).
- **2**. To select an option, highlight it and press **(PR)**.
- ► **Go to Lap List** to display a saved Lap List. Press **Detail** (left softkey) to display the lap list detail.
- **Save to Lap List** to save the recorded lap times.
- **Reset** to reset the time to zero and clear any recorded lap times.

Downloading through Wireless Web

Your phone allows you to download images (screen savers), ringers, games, etc., from a website. It is also possible to download from certain menus (Contacts list, Ringer Setting, or Display Setting).

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **(87)**.

Shortcut: Instead of steps 1 and 2 above, press the navigation key down.

- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display options.
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press **(19)** to start up the browser.
- **5.** Select your desired image or ringer file, and follow the system prompts.

Confirming the Downloaded Data

The downloaded data will be automatically classified as games, ringers, images (screen savers) or an application folder. However, if any data has a different category, it is classified as a Dynamic folder. If data doesn't belong to any of the above categories, it is classified in the Others folder.

To confirm the downloaded games folder:

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **.**
- **3.** Highlight your desired data folder (for example, **Games**, **Ringers**, or **Screen Savers**) and press **(P)**.
- 4. Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press **(**.

Tip: The names of dynamic folders are variable depending on data.

Downloaded Data Options

Selecting Download Settings

This feature is available when you select a Java application.

To select the settings for the downloaded data:

- **1.** Press **(1)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **\$**.
- 3. Highlight Games or Applications and press 🐨.
- **4.** Highlight the data for which you want to select settings and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight Network Access and press 🐨.
- 7. Highlight your desired option and press 🐨.

Assigning the Downloaded Data

To assign the downloaded data:

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **.**
- 3. Highlight Ringers or Screen Savers and press 🐨.
- **4.** Highlight the data you want to assign and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight Set as and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight the menu you want to assign and press 🐨.

Sorting the downloaded data

The files downloaded via website are stored in alphabetical order. You may store the data in memory size order:

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **(BP)**.
- **3.** Highlight each folder that includes the downloaded data you want to sort and press **(Provide Section 2019)**.
- 4. Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight Sort by and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight Name or Size and press 🐨.

Viewing the Downloaded Data Size

This feature allows you to confirm each downloaded data size and the rest of the download capacity.

- **1**. Press **(1)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **.**
- **3.** Highlight each folder that includes the downloaded data you want to confirm and press **(B)**.
- 4. Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight **lcon/Size** and press . (Data size is displayed at the left of the downloaded data name.)

Viewing the memory space for downloading

This feature allows you to confirm how much memory is left and used for downloading.

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **\$**.
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- **4.** Highlight **View Memory** and press **(**Used and Free memory size are displayed.)

Erasing the Downloaded Data

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **.**
- **3.** Highlight a folder and press **.**
- **4.** Highlight the downloaded data you want to erase and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Erase** and press **(B)**.
- 6. Follow the onscreen prompts to erase the data.

Tip: To erase all data, select Erase All during step 5 above.

Note: It takes a while when you erase a large amount of downloaded data.

9. Voice Services

Using Voice-Activated Dialing

You can use a Voice Dial tag to automatically dial a phone number in your Contacts list. Your phone can store up to 30 Voice Dial tags. (To create a Voice Dial tag, see "Programming Voice Dial Tag to Your Phone" below.)

With the flip open:

- 1. Press TALK or SPEAKER briefly.
- **2.** Follow the voice prompts and recite the entry's Voice Dial tag into your phone's microphone.

With the flip closed:

- 1. Press and hold .
- **2.** Follow the system prompts and recite the entry's Voice Dial tag into your phone's microphone.

Note: To use this feature, you must have stored entries (see "Programming Voice Dial Tag to Your Phone" below).

Programming Voice Dial Tag to Your Phone

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Voice Dial and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight **Program** and press 🐨.
- **6.** The phone will prompt you to say the name you want to program. Wait for the beep and then say the name.
- 7. Respond to the prompt by repeating the name after the beep.
- 8. Highlight the Voice Dial entry (name) in the Contacts list, and press .

9. Select the phone number you want to program and press **(**. (The display shows "Voice Dial Recorded".)

Note: Record Voice Dial tags in a quiet environment and without the aid of an accessory.

Reviewing Voice Dialing Tags

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Voice Dial and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight Review or Review:Speaker and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight the desired entry and press 🐨.

- or -

Highlight the desired entry and press **Options** (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press **@**.

Options:

- Play to play the recorded voice dial tag.
- ► **Speaker On** to play the recorded voice dial tag in speakerphone mode. (If you are in speakerphone mode, the option will appear as **Speaker Off** to deactivate.)
- **Erase** to erase the voice dial tag. Select **Yes** to erase and **No** to cancel.

Erasing All Voice Dial Tags

- 1. Press 🌚 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Voice Dial and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight **Erase All** and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight **Yes** and press **(BP)**.

Managing Voice Memos

You can use your phone's Voice Services to record brief memos during a call.

Recording Voice Memos

To record a voice memo:

- 1. Press 🏶 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Voice Memo and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight **Record** and press **\$**.
- 6. Start recording after the beep.

To end the recording of your memo:

▶ Press (MENU, BACK, or END/O).

Tip: To record in speakerphone mode, press and hold (REANER) in standby mode.

To record the other party's voice during a phone call:

- **1.** During a call, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Voice Memo and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight **Record** and press **(B)**.
- 6. Start recording after the beep.

To end the recording of voice memo:

Press er or -

Press (1) and disconnect the call when recording in Use State.

Recording also stops when the other party hangs up the call.

Memo recording during a phone call is disabled while you are roaming in analog service areas. ▶ When the recording capacity is full, highlight an old memo, press **Erase** (left softkey), highlight **Yes**, and press ♥ to make room for additional memos.

Note: Your phone can store up to 12 memos and the total available recording time is 72 seconds (maximum of 18 seconds per memo).

Tip: Voice Memos are stored with the date and time stamp in reverse chronological order, except when recorded in a no service area.

Reviewing Voice Memos

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Voice Memo and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight Play or Play:Speaker and press 🐨.
- **6.** Highlight one memo from the list and press **(P)**.

If you want to play all memos continuously, highlight **All** and press **(**.

- 7. Press 🐨 to stop playing.
- You can change the message playing speed by pressing Slow (left softkey) or Fast (right softkey).
- To play the newer/older memo, press the navigation key right or left.

Tip: To set the speakerphone mode on or off, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Speaker On/Off**, and press **w** during step 6 above.

Erasing Voice Memos

To erase all voice memos:

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Voice Memo and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight **Erase All** and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight **Yes** and press **(BP)**.

To erase an individual memo:

- 1. Follow steps 1-4 above.
- 2. Highlight Play or Play:Speaker and press 🐨.
- **3.** Display the memo list, highlight the memo you want to erase, and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 4. Highlight **Erase** and press **(B)**.
- 5. Highlight **Yes** and press **(B)**.

Setting Up Screen Call

This feature enables you to answer incoming calls by using prerecorded announcements, either one that is pre-recorded or one that you record. You can also record the caller's message into the Voice Memo list. To listen to the message, see "Reviewing Voice Memos" on page 87.

Activating Screen Call

To start Screen Call when you have incoming calls:

- **1.** When the phone rings or vibrates, press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 2. Highlight Screen Call and press 🐨.

To set Auto Screen Call:

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Screen Call and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight Auto and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight **On** and press **(B)**.
- If you want to change the answer time, enter your desired number (from 1 to 10 seconds) by using numeric keys or the navigation key up or down.
- **7.** Press **(Press (Press)** or **(DK)** (left softkey). The **(**³⁾ icon is displayed on the Standby display.

Tip: If a new caller's message is waiting, **E** appears on the display. The memos recorded while activating "Screen Call" are shown with "**J**" or "**1**" icon in the list. ("**J**": once played, "**1**": not played yet)

Tip: While the caller is recording: Pressing (1) stops recording and disconnects the call. Pressing (1) answers the call.

Selecting Announcement for Screen Call

- **1.** Press **(1)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Tools/Extras** and press **.**
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Screen Call and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight Announcement and press 🐨.
- 6. Depending on your preference, highlight **Pre-Recorded** or **Custom**, and press .

Recording Name for Pre-Recorded Announcement

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Screen Call and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight Announcement and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight **Pre-Recorded** and press **Edit** (right softkey).
- 7. Highlight **Record Name** and press **(BP)**.
- ► If your name has already been recorded, select **Yes** or **No** for overwriting.
- 8. Press 🛞 to start the 1st recording. (Press 🛞 to stop recording.)
- **9.** After the 1st recording, press again to start the 2nd recording.
- 10. To stop recording, wait for 12 seconds or press 🐨.

Recording Customized Announcement

- **1.** Follow steps 1-5 on the previous page.
- **2.** Highlight **Custom** and press **Edit** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Record** and press **(B)**.
- If your announcement has already been recorded, select Yes or No for overwriting.
- 4. Press 🐨 to start the 1st recording. (Press 🐨 to stop recording.)
- **5.** After the 1st recording, press again to start the 2nd recording.
- 6. To stop recording, wait for 12 seconds or press 🐨.

Reviewing an Announcement

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Screen Call and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight Announcement and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight **Pre-Recorded** or **Custom** and press **Edit** (right softkey).
- 7. Highlight Play or Play:Speaker and press 🐨.

Erasing an Announcement

- **1.** Follow steps 1-6 above.
- Highlight Erase Name to erase name for Pre-Recorded announcement and press .
 or -

Highlight **Erase** to erase message for Custom and press **\$**.

3. Highlight **Yes** and press **(B)**.

10. 10-4

10-4 allows you to enjoy quick, two-way, "walkie-talkie-style" communication with your friends, family, and co-workers. You can make 1-to-1 or 1-to-many calls (up to 5 others on the same call) to any other 10-4 user, anywhere on the Network. You can make and receive 10-4 calls when your phone displays

Setting 10-4 Mode

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight 10-4 and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Enable/Disable and press 🐨.
- 5. Select **Enable** and press **(**. (The default setting is **Disable**.)
- ► Enable: Lets you make or receive 10-4 calls any time your phone is not in use.
- ▶ **Disable:** Disables your phone's 10-4 service; you will not be able to make or receive 10-4 calls or access your 10-4 contacts.

10-4 Call Alerts

There are several ways your Phone alerts you during 10-4 calls.

When you make or receive a 10-4 call:

- The phone beeps (depending on the Ringer Type).
- The backlight illuminates.
- ▶ The screen displays a 10-4 call message.
- The other party's 10-4 number and name (if available) are displayed.
- ▶ The screen displays who has the floor.

The status of a 10-4 call:

- ▶ The LED On indicates you or another contact have the floor.
- The LED Off indicates the floor is open. (You can take the floor and speak by pressing and holding unit).)

Displaying the 10-4 List

Tip: The first time you access the list, the 10-4 Help message will appear. Press \underline{Yes} (left softkey) and \underline{Next} (left softkey) to read a brief introduction of 10-4.

Selecting Contacts Lists

When your phone displays a 10-4 List, the left softkey is labeled **Go to**. To switch to another contacts list, press the left softkey, highlight your desired list, and press ().

- ▶ Company List/Company Groups contain company-provided contacts (up to 200 entries). Your company list can only be created and modified by an authorized administrator on the 10-4 server. When the lists are empty, Company List/ Company Groups will not appear on the display. You cannot add, edit, or delete Company List items, but you can copy entries to your Personal List/Personal Groups.
- Personal List/Personal Groups contain your personal 10-4 contact names and numbers, separately or in groups. You can create and edit your own Personal List. Your phone can store a total of 200 entries (you may include up to five contacts per group).
- **Outgoing** shows the last 10 different 10-4 calls you placed.
- ▶ **Incoming** shows the last 10 different 10-4 calls you accepted.
- **Missed** shows the last 10 10-4 calls you missed.

Tip: You can also select Enter 10-4# from Go to option to enter a 10-4 number directly. See page 96 for details.

Note: The 🕥 icon next to the group name indicates a group.

Making a 10-4 Call (1-to-1 Call)

You can place a 1-to-1 10-4 call by entering a 10-4 number or by selecting a contact from the 10-4 List.

- **1.** Press **10-4** (left softkey) or press **10-4** List.
- Press Goto (left softkey), highlight the list from which you want to place a call (Company List, Personal List, Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed), and press .
- Highlight the contact you want to call, and press and hold
 to place the call and get the floor. (You will see
 10-4 calling... and Connecting... followed by "You have floor." You can now begin speaking.)
 or -

Highlight the contact you want to call and press and release **(IIII)** to place the call. (The call will connect as described above, but "**Floor is open**." will appear on the screen and either you or your contact may press and hold **(IIII)** to take the floor and speak.)

Note: During a 10-4 call, the "**floor**" is the right to speak. When you see "**Floor is open.**," the first person to press the 10-4 button (**Charlen D**) can speak (while holding the button). Only the person who has the floor can speak. The phone beeps if you press the 10-4 button when another contact has the floor.

- **4.** Continue holding **(1)** as you speak. When you are finished speaking, release the 10-4 button to allow other contacts to speak. (When the other party takes the floor, you will see the speaker's name and phone number and the text "**has floor**.")
- 5. When you are finished, press END/O.

Note: When neither party has the floor during a 10-4 call, "**Floor is open**." appears on the display. If no one takes the floor for 20 seconds, the 10-4 call ends automatically.

Tip: If you press **TALK** or **STARE** during step 3 above, you can make a standard voice call.

Making a 10-4 Call (Group Call)

You can make a 10-4 call to all members in a Group entry, which you have in your 10-4 List. You can communicate with up to five members at a time.

- **1.** Press **10-4** (left softkey) or press **10-4** List.
- Press Go to (left softkey), highlight the list from which you want to make a Group call (Company Groups, Personal Groups, or Outgoing), and press .
- 3. Highlight the group you want to call, and press and hold to place the call and take the floor. (You will see
 10-4 calling... and Connecting... followed by "You have floor." Continue with the 10-4 call as described previously.)
- ► To make a 10-4 call to a group member, select your desired group, highlight your desired group member, and press and hold .
- If one of the group members takes the floor, you will see the member's name and 10-4 number on the display. The phone beeps if you press the 10-4 button when another contact has the floor.
- 4. When the call is finished, press END/0.

Tip: You can also make a Group Call after checking the group member. Press return to display group members, highlight **<Call Group>** and press and hold **Group** during step 3 above.

Making a 10-4 Call by Entering a Number

- 1. From standby mode, enter the 10-4 number you want to dial.
- **2.** Press **und** to place the 10-4 call.
- The contact's name appears if there is a matched number in your 10-4 List.
- **3.** Continue with the 10-4 call, pressing and holding **und** to speak and releasing it to allow others to reply.
- 4. When the call is finished, press **END/O**.

- or -

- **1.** Press **10-4** (left softkey) or press **110-4** List.
- 2. Press Goto (left softkey), highlight Enter 10-4# and press 🐨.
- **3**. Enter the 10-4 number you want to dial.
- 4. Follow steps 2-4 above.

Missed Call Notification for 10-4 Calls

When an incoming 10-4 Call is not answered, the Missed Call Notification is displayed on your screen.

To call the last Missed 10-4 Call:

Simply press and hold while the Missed Call Notification is displayed. (Continue with the 10-4 call as described previously.)

To display the Missed 10-4 Call Log:

Press View (left softkey). To call the entry, highlight the entry you want to call, and press and hold www. (Continue with the 10-4 call as described previously.)

Note: When you display Missed Calls entries, you will see the **G** icon next to the name. Once you confirm the entry by pressing (**W**), the icon turns to the **G** icon. The **G** icon will remain until you make or receive a 10-4 call to or from the entry.

Receiving a 10-4 Call

- **1.** Make sure your phone's 10-4 mode is enabled (see "Setting 10-4 Mode" on page 92).
- **2.** When you receive a 10-4 call from a contact, "10-4 Call," the contact's name, and the 10-4 number appear on the display.
- When you receive a group call, "Group Call" and the 10-4 number appear.
- If nobody takes the floor for 20 seconds, the call will be a missed 10-4 call.
- **3.** If the person placing the call has kept the floor (held the 10-4 button), you will see the contact name and 10-4 number along with **"has floor**," and you will hear the caller speaking.
- 4. When the caller finishes speaking and releases **(IIII)**, you will see "**Floor is open**." on the display screen. Press and hold **(IIII)** to take the floor and reply to the caller. (You will see "**You have floor.**" and hear a tone confirming that you may speak.)
- 5. When the conversation is finished, press **ENDO**.

Tip: You can also receive a 10-4 call with the flip closed. Press **mm** and hold to take the floor when the floor is open.

10-4 Options

When you use 10-4, several user options are available by pressing **Options** (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press **(P)**.

- **Edit** to edit a 10-4 number and/or name. (See page 103.)
- **Send Text** to send a text message. (See page 112 for details.)
- Copy to Personal to copy a contact to the Personal List.
 Copy Group appears when you highlight a group. (This option doesn't appear if the entry is already in the Personal List or when you select Personal List/Personal Groups.)
- **Copy to Ph. Book** to copy a contact to the Contacts List.
- **Erase** to erase a contact. **Erase Group** appears when you highlight a group.
- Add Contact to add a new contact. (See page 101 for details.)
 Add Group appears when you highlight a group list. (See page 102 for details.)
- Find:First Name to find a contact by first name. Find:Full Name appears when your phone's setting is "Find:First Name".
- **Erase 10-4 List** to erase entries saved in the 10-4 List (except Company List/Company Groups).
- **Help** to see the 10-4 instruction page.

Copying an Entry to Personal List or Personal Group List

You can copy an entry to your Personal List/Personal Groups from several different sources. If the selected entry is already stored in the Personal List/Personal Groups, the "copy" option does not appear.

- **1.** Press **10-4** (left softkey) or press **111** to access the 10-4 List.
- Press Go to (left softkey), highlight the list from which you want to copy an entry (Company List, Company Groups, Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed), and press .
- **3.** Highlight the entry you want to copy (or scroll to highlight the **Redial** entry at the top of your screen) and press **Options** (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press **(Provide)**
- **Copy to Personal** to copy the contact to the Personal List.
- **Copy Group** to copy the group to the Personal Group List.
- **Copy to Ph. Book** to copy the contact to the Contacts list.
- **4.** Press **Yes** (left softkey) to copy and save the entry to your Personal List or Personal Group List.

Saving a 10-4 Number

You can save a 10-4 number from the ending display to your Personal List/Personal Groups.

- **1.** From the ending display, press **Save** (right softkey).
- 2. Enter a name and press 🐨.
- **3.** Press **Save** (left softkey).

Finding an Entry in the 10-4 List

You can find your desired entry by entering a few letters.

Adding a New Contact to Your Personal List

You can store the total of 200 entries in the Personal List/ Personal Groups.

- 3. Highlight <Add Contact> and press ...
 or Highlight an entry and press Options (right softkey). Then highlight Add Contact and press ...

New Messages

When you receive new messages, the message notification and the [T] icon will appear. Press [View] (left softkey) to display the message details.

- Press Call (left softkey) to dial the phone number. (Appears when a callback number is highlighted.)
- Press Reply (left softkey) to reply the message. (Appears when a phone number or email address is highlighted.)
- Press Go (left softkey) to go to the website. (Appears when a URL is highlighted.)
- Press Forward (left softkey) to forward the message. (Appears only if there are no phone numbers and URLs in the message.)
- Press Options (right softkey) to display options. (See page 114 for details.)

Tip: You may receive a Service Indication (SI) message on your phone. It consists of header information, the text message and an URL, where more information can be retrieved. To display the message details, press **View** (left softkey).

Message Storage

Your phone can store up to 200 received Messages, 180 sent Messages, and 20 Web Alerts. When the message memory is full, the oldest unlocked message will be deleted automatically (see page 116 for locking the message).

Displaying Messages

To display a Message from the message notification alert, see "New Messages" on the previous page.

To display a Message from the main menu:

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.

Shortcut: Press the navigation key up to display the Messaging menu.

- 3. Highlight **Text Msgs** and press (The folder list appears.)
- 4. Highlight Inbox, Sent, Outbox, Drafts, or your defined folder and press (. (The message list appears.)
- 5. Highlight the header of the message you want to see and press **(**The message detail appears.)

To display Web Alerts:

- **Erase Read Msgs** to erase read messages in the folder (except locked messages). (Inbox and your defined folder only.)
- **Erase All** to erase all messages in the folder (except locked messages). A warning message appears if there are unread messages.

Tip: You can lock up to 40 messages. Locked messages will be displayed with **Q**.

Tip: To make a call from the list, highlight a message and press (if applicable).

- ► **Send Text** to display phone numbers and email addresses to send a message.
- **Reply** to reply to the message. (Message in Inbox and defined folder only.)
- **Forward** to forward the message.
- Move to move the message to another folder. Select a folder and press or press <Add Folder> to create a new folder. (Message in Inbox and defined folder only.)
- Lock to lock the message. Locked messages will not be erased automatically. To unlock the message, select Unlock and press .
- **Font Size** to change the font size.
- ► Save to Ph. Book to save the phone number, email address and URLs. Select a data category and press (to save.
- Go to Phone Book to go to the Contacts list (if applicable).
- **Copy to Personal** to copy the phone number to the 10-4 Personal List (if applicable).
- **Compose New** to compose a new message.
- **Erase** to erase the message.

Changing the Display Font Size of a Message

After you display a Message in the Inbox, Sent, or your defined folder, press **Options** (right softkey) to display message options.

Prepending a Phone Number From a Message

- **11.** Press **Save** (left softkey).

To set an optional feature for the added folder:

- Notify to set the display notification to on or off when you have unread message matching the defined folder.

12. Service Features

Using Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you to new voicemail messages:

- ▶ By displaying a message on the screen.
- By playing the assigned ringer type.
- By blinking the LED.
- ▶ By displaying 🖓 at the top of your screen.

Displaying Voicemail Details

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voicemail and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Details** and press **(BP)**.

Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages

Press and hold 1. (Your phone will dial your voicemail box.)

- or -

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.
- **3.** Highlight **Voicemail** and press **(B)**.
- 4. Highlight Call Voicemail and press 🐨.

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your Phone.

Clearing the Message Icon

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.
- **3.** Highlight **Voicemail** and press **(B)**.
- 4. Highlight Clear Count and press 🐨.
- 5. Highlight **Yes** and press **.**

Editing Your Voicemail Number

To edit your voicemail number:

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Voicemail and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Edit Voicemail# and press \$\$.
- 5. Edit your voicemail number and press 🐨.

To reset your voicemail number:

- 1. Follow steps 1-4 above.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight Reset Voicemail# and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Yes** and press **.**

Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

Press (or press Options) [right softkey], highlight Flash and press (). This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.

To respond to an incoming call when Answer on Hold is activated:

Press TALK (or press Options [right softkey], highlight Flash, and press (). (The Answer on Hold will be automatically deactivated. See page 13 for Answer on Hold.)

To switch back to the first caller:

Press (or press options [right softkey], highlight Flash and press) again.

Note: Call Waiting may not be available while roaming off the home network.

Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press **TALK** or **SPEAKER**.
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press TALK (or press **Options** [right softkey], highlight **Three-Way Call** and press (**) to put the first caller on hold.
- **3.** Enter the second number you wish to call and press (or press **Options** [right softkey], highlight **Call** or **Call:Speaker On** and press (9).
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press **TALK** again (or press **Options** [right softkey], highlight **Flash** and press **(P)** to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Web

With Web on your phone, you will be able to browse full-color graphic versions – not just text versions – of your favorite website, making it easier than ever to stay informed while on the go. Check sports scores, trade stocks, and shop all on your phone.

Launching the Web

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Web and press 🐨.

Net Guard

With the Net Guard setting, the confirmation display will appear to connect to the Internet. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting **Always Auto-Connect** when the Net Guard is displayed.

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Internet and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Net Guard and press 🐨.
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** and press **(BP)**.
- **On** to make the Net Guard appear when connecting to the Internet.
- **Off** to avoid the Net Guard when connecting to the Internet.

Note: When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once per session. The Net Guard does not appear if the phone is merely re-connecting due to a time-out.

Browsing the Web

Creating a Bookmark

Bookmarks allow you to store the address of your favorite websites for easy access at a later time.

- 1. Launch the Web page you want to mark.
- **2**. Press (right softkey) to go to the browser menu.
- **3.** Highlight **Mark this page** and press **()** or **OK** (left softkey).

Note: Bookmarking a page does not store the page contents, just its address. Some pages cannot be bookmarked. Whether a particular Web page may be marked is controlled by its creator.

Accessing a Bookmark

- 1. Access the browser menu by pressing 🔳 (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight View Bookmarks and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight the bookmark you'd like to access and press **(P)** or **(OK)** (left softkey) to go to the website.

Editing a Bookmark

- 1. Launch the Web and press 🔳 (right softkey) to access the browser menu.
- 2. Highlight View Bookmarks and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Select the bookmark you wish to edit and press (right softkey).
- 4. Select Edit Address or Edit Title and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **5.** Press **Edit** (right softkey), use your keypad to edit the address or title, and press **OK** (left softkey).
- 6. To save the bookmark, press **OK** (left softkey).

Deleting a Bookmark

- **1.** Access **View Bookmarks** menu as outlined on the previous page in steps 1-2.
- **2.** Highlight the bookmark you wish to erase and press (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Delete** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- 4. Press Yes (right softkey).

Tip: To delete all bookmarks, select **Delete All** during step 3 above.

Moving a Bookmark

- 1. Access the View Bookmarks menu as outlined in steps 1-2 on the previous page, and press 🔳 (right softkey).
- **2.** Highlight **Reorder** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight the bookmark you wish to move and press **Move** (left softkey).
- **4.** Move the bookmark to a new location by pressing the navigation key up or down and press **Drop** (left softkey).
- 5. When you're finished, press **Finish** (right softkey).

Going to a Specific Website

- 1. Launch the Web and press 🔳 (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- 2. Highlight Go to URL... and press OK (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Address** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **4.** Use your keypad to enter the URL of the website you wish to go to, and press **OK** (left softkey).

Note: Not all websites are viewable on your phone.

Reloading a Web Page

- 1. Launch the Web and press 🔳 (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- 2. Highlight **Refresh this page** and press **OK** (left softkey).

Restarting the Web Browser

If the Web browser appears to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

- **1.** From an active Internet connection, press (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- 2. Highlight More... and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Restart Browser** and press **OK** (left softkey).

Sending a Web Page

This feature allows you to send a URL (website address) you're viewing through SMS text messaging.

- 1. Launch the Web and press 🔳 (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- 2. Highlight More... and press OK (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Send Page** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **4.** To complete and send a Web Page, follow steps 4-11 in "Sending a Message" on page 112.

Adjusting the Browser Sound Volume

- 1. Launch the Web and press 🔳 (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- **2.** Highlight **More**... and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Preferences** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- 4. Highlight **Sound Volume** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **5.** Highlight your desired volume level by pressing the navigation key up or down and press **(19)**.

Selecting Your Preference Settings

- 1. Launch the Web and press (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- 2. Highlight More... and press OK (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Preferences** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **4.** Highlight the setting you want to change and press **OK** (left softkey).
- 5. Select your preference setting and press 🐨.

Games

Downloading Games

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **(P)**.
- 3. Highlight Games and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press **W**. The browser will launch and take you to the Games download menu.
- **5.** Use your navigation key to highlight and select a game you wish to download.
- 6. Follow the system prompts to download.

Note: The maximum number of downloaded files that can be stored in your phone is 100 files.

Playing Games

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **.**
- 3. Highlight Games and press 🐨.
- 4. Select the game you wish to play and press 🐨.
- **5.** Press the left softkey if a prompt displays the days remaining on the game license.
- **6.** Follow the onscreen instructions to play the game. When you are finished, press (NDTO).
- 7. A prompt will display: "Resume the Application?" Select **Yes** to continue playing or **No** to exit.

Ringers

Downloading Ringers

- 1. Press 🌚 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Downloads and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight **Ringers** and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press **(P)**. The browser will launch and take you to the Ringers download menu.
- **5.** Use your navigation key to highlight and select a ringer you wish to download.
- 6. Follow the system prompts to download.

Note: The maximum number of downloaded files that can be stored in your phone is 100 files.

Assigning Downloaded Ringers

Downloaded ringers may be assigned directly from the Downloads menu and are also available through the Settings menu.

- 1. Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Downloads and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight **Ringers** and press **(1977)**.
- **4.** Highlight a downloaded ringer and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight Set as and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight Voice Calls, Voicemail, Messaging, Calender/Alarm, Start-up Tone, Power-off Tone, or Phone Book, 10-4 Calls, and press (1). The following two items require an extra step:
- ► Voice Calls: highlight With Caller ID or No Caller ID, and press .
- ▶ Phone Book: highlight your desired entry and press ∰.

(A message appears confirming the data has been assigned.)

Downloading Screen Savers (Images)

- **1.** Press 🐨 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **.**
- 3. Highlight Screen Savers and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press **(P)**. The browser will launch and take you to the Screen Savers download menu.
- **5.** Use your navigation key to highlight and select a Screen Saver you wish to download.
- 6. Follow the system prompts to download.

Note: The maximum number of downloaded files that can be stored in your phone is 100 files.

Assigning Downloaded Screen Savers (Images)

Downloaded Screen Savers may be assigned directly from the Downloads menu and are also available through the Settings menu.

- **1.** Press **(1)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **(B)**.
- 3. Highlight Screen Savers and press 🐨.
- **4.** Highlight a downloaded Screen Saver and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Select Set as and press 🐨.
- 6. Highlight one of **Incoming Calls**, **Screen Saver**, or **Phone Book**, and press **(19)**. The following item needs an extra step:
- ▶ Phone Book: highlight your desired entry and press ∰.

(A message appears confirming the data has been assigned.)

Note: Depending on the data, you can select where to assign the data: Image data: **Incoming Calls, Screen Saver**, or **Phone Book**. Animation data: **Standby, Outgoing Calls**, or **Service Search**.

Note: You may assign a Screen Saver to more than one task.

13. Safety Guidelines

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

- > Try not to hold, bend, or twist the phone's antenna.
- Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, turn the power off and immediately remove the battery.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions.

- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- > Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radiofrequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone or set your phone to Airplane mode before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, Transport Canada regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone off when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn your phone off when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone and accessories could generate sparks. Sparks can cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Any area where it is very humid and with inflammables.
- ▶ Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to Your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it as they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your telephone bill.

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only approved batteries, AC adapters, and chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- ► In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 0° C to 45° C (32° F to 113° F).
- Don't store the battery in a high humidity environment.
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- ▶ Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- ▶ Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- ▶ Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Less than one month: -20° C to 60° C (-4° F to 140° F)

More than one month: -20° C to 45° C (-4° F to 113° F)

Disposal of Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) Batteries

For safe disposal options of your Li-Ion batteries, please ensure that disposal of this in accordance with law and regulation.

- Do not dispose of the battery in fire; the cell may explode.
- Do not open or puncture the battery; the released electrolyte is corrosive and may cause damage to the eyes and skin.

Special Note: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Note: For safety, do not handle a damaged or leaking Li-lon battery.

Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending or sitting on it.

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
