

#### Getting started

The microphone at the top of the device is active only when you use the speakerphone or take videos.




- Do not cover the antenna area with your hands or other objects. This may cause connectivity problems or drain the battery.
- Do not use a screen protector. This causes sensor malfunctions.
- Do not allow water to contact the touch screen. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



# Installing the SIM card and battery

Insert the SIM card provided by the mobile telephone service provider, and the included battery.



- · Only microSIM cards work with the device.
- Some LTE services may not be available depending on the service provider. For details about service availability, contact your service provider.
- 1 Remove the back cover.






Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.



Do not bend or twist the back cover excessively. Doing so may damage the cover.


2 Insert the SIM card with the gold-coloured contacts facing downwards.




3 Push the SIM card into the slot until it locks in place.



- Do not insert a memory card into the SIM card slot. If a memory card happens to be lodged in the SIM card slot, take the device to a Samsung Service Centre to remove the memory card.
- Use caution not to lose or let others use the SIM card. Samsung is not responsible for any damages or inconveniences caused by lost or stolen cards.
- 4 Insert the battery.




5 Replace the back cover.




## Removing the SIM card and battery

- 1 Remove the back cover.
- 2 Pull out the battery.

# Charging the battery

Use the charger to charge the battery before using it for the first time. A computer can be also used to charge the device by connecting them via the USB cable.




Use only Samsung-approved chargers, batteries, and cables. Unapproved chargers or cables can cause the battery to explode or damage the device.




- When the battery power is low, the device emits a warning tone and displays a low battery power message.
- If the battery is completely discharged, the device cannot be turned on immediately when the charger is connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before turning on the device.
- If you use multiple applications at once, network applications, or applications
  that need a connection to another device, the battery will drain quickly. To avoid
  disconnecting from the network or losing power during a data transfer, always use
  these applications after fully charging the battery.
- This device is compatible with USB 3.0 and under devices. When using a USB 3.0 device, make sure to use a USB 3.0 cable.

### Charging with the charger

Connect the USB cable to the USB power adapter and then plug the end of the USB cable into the multipurpose jack.



When using a USB 2.0 cable, plug the USB cable into the right side of the multipurpose jack as shown in the image below.





Connecting the charger improperly may cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.



- The device can be used while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- If the device receives an unstable power supply while charging, the touch screen may not function. If this happens, unplug the charger from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect the device's lifespan or performance. If the battery gets hotter than usual, the charger may stop charging.
- If the device is not charging properly, take the device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.

After fully charging, disconnect the device from the charger. First unplug the charger from the device, and then unplug it from the electric socket.




Do not remove the battery before removing the charger. This may damage the device.



To save energy, unplug the charger when not in use. The charger does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the charger from the electric socket when not in use to avoid wasting power. The device should remain close to the electric socket while charging.

### Checking the battery charge status

When you charge the battery while the device is off, the following icons will show the current battery charge status:



### Reducing the battery consumption

Your device provides options that help you save battery power. By customizing these options and deactivating features in the background, you can use the device longer between charges:

- When you are not using the device, switch to sleep mode by pressing the Power button.
- Close unnecessary applications with the task manager.
- Deactivate the Bluetooth feature.
- · Deactivate the Wi-Fi feature.
- Deactivate auto-syncing of applications.
- Decrease the backlight time.
- Decrease the brightness of the display.

# Inserting a memory card


Your device accepts memory cards with maximum capacity of 64 GB. Depending on the memory card manufacturer and type, some memory cards may not be compatible with your device.



- Some memory cards may not be fully compatible with the device. Using an incompatible card may damage the device or the memory card, or corrupt the data stored in it.
- Use caution to insert the memory card right-side up.



- The device supports the FAT and the exFAT file systems for memory cards. When
  inserting a card formatted in a different file system, the device asks to reformat the
  memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data shortens the lifespan of memory cards.
- When inserting a memory card into the device, the memory card's file directory appears in the Samsung → My Files → All → SD memory card folder.
- 1 Remove the back cover.
- 2 Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing downwards.
- 3 Push the memory card into the slot until it locks in place.



4 Replace the back cover.

### Removing the memory card

Before removing the memory card, first unmount it for safe removal. On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow General \rightarrow Storage \rightarrow Unmount SD card$ .

- 1 Remove the back cover.
- 2 Push the memory card until it disengages from the device, and then pull it out.
- 3 Replace the back cover.



Do not remove the memory card while the device is transferring or accessing information. Doing so can cause data to be lost or corrupted or damage to the memory card or device. Samsung is not responsible for losses that result from the misuse of damaged memory cards, including the loss of data.

### Formatting the memory card

A memory card formatted on a computer may not be compatible with the device. Format the memory card on the device.

On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow General \rightarrow Storage \rightarrow Format SD card \rightarrow$  Format SD card  $\rightarrow$  Erase everything.




Before formatting the memory card, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on the device. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data resulting from user actions.


# Replacing the S Pen nib

While using the S Pen, the S Pen nib may get dull. If the nib is dull, replace it with a new one.

1 Hold the nib with the tweezer firmly, and then pull it out.



2 Insert a new nib into the S Pen until you hear a click.





Do not let your finger get caught between the tweezer and the nib.



- Do not reuse old nibs. Doing so may cause the S Pen to malfunction.
- Do not press the nib excessively when inserting the nib into the S Pen.
- Do not insert the round end of the nib into the S Pen. This may cause damage to the S Pen or your device.




The black-coloured nib has a white rubber cap on the tip. If the rubber cap is worn down, replace the nib with a new one.

# Turning the device on and off

When turning on the device for the first time, follow the on-screen instructions to set up your device.

Press and hold the Power button for a few seconds to turn on the device on and off.





- Follow all posted warnings and directions from authorized personnel in areas where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.
- Press and hold the Power button and tap Flight mode to disable the wireless features.

To turn off the device, press and hold the Power button, and then tap **Power off**.

# Holding the device

Do not cover the antenna area with your hands or other objects. This may cause connectivity problems or drain the battery.

# Adjusting the volume

Press the Volume button up or down to adjust the ringtone volume, or to adjust the sound volume when playing music or video.

# Switching to silent mode

Use one of the following methods:

- Press and hold the Volume button down until it switches to silent mode.
- Press and hold the Power button, and then tap **Mute** or **Vibrate**.
- Open the notifications panel at the top of the screen, and then tap **Sound** or **Vibrate**.

# Using the touch screen

Use only fingers or the S Pen to use the touch screen.



- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- To avoid damaging the touch screen, do not tap it with anything sharp or apply excessive pressure to it with your fingertips.



- The device may not recognize touch inputs close to the edges of the screen, which are outside of the touch input area.
- Leaving the touch screen idle for extended periods may result in afterimages (screen burn-in) or ghosting. Turn off the touch screen when you do not use the device.

### Finger gestures

### **Tapping**

To open an application, to select a menu item, to press an on-screen button, or to enter a character using the on-screen keyboard, tap it with a finger.



### **Tapping and holding**


Tap and hold an item for more than 2 seconds to access available options.


### Dragging

To move an icon, thumbnail, or preview to a new location, tap and hold it and drag it to the target position.



### **Double-tapping**


Double-tap on a webpage, map, or image to zoom in a part. Double-tap again to return.


### **Flicking**

Flick left or right on the Home screen or the Applications screen to see another panel. Flick up or down to scroll through a webpage or a list, such as contacts.



### **Pinching**

Spread two fingers apart on a webpage, map, or image to zoom in a part. Pinch to zoom out.



### **Control motions**

Simple motions allow easy control of the device.


Before using motions, make sure the motion feature is activated. On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls \rightarrow Motions$ , and then drag the Motions switch to the right.



Excessive shaking or impact to the device may result in unintended inputs. Control motions properly.

### Rotating the screen

Many applications allow display in either portrait or landscape orientation. Rotating the device causes the display to automatically adjust to fit the new screen orientation.



To prevent the display from rotating automatically, open the notifications panel and deselect **Screen rotation**.



- Some applications do not allow screen rotation.
- Some applications display a different screen depending on the orientation. The calculator turns into a scientific calculator when rotated to landscape.

### Picking up

When you pick up the device after it has been idle for some time or when the screen has turned off, it vibrates if you have missed calls or new messages.




### Holding to ear

While viewing call, message, or contact details, pick up and hold the device to your ear to make a call.



# **Turning over**


Turn over the device to mute ringtone or pause media playback.

### **Tilting**

Tap and hold two points on the screen, and then tilt the device back and forth to zoom in or out.




### **Palm motions**

Use palm motions to control the device by touching the screen.

Before using motions, make sure the palm motion feature is activated. On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls \rightarrow Palm motion$ , and then drag the Palm motion switch to the right.

### **Sweeping**

Sweep your hand across the screen to capture a screenshot. The image is saved in **Gallery**  $\rightarrow$  **Screenshots**. It is not possible to capture a screenshot while using some applications.



### Covering

Cover the screen with a palm to pause media playback.



### **Air Gesture**

Use this feature to control functions without touching the screen.


Before using this feature, make sure the air gesture feature is activated. On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls \rightarrow Air gesture$ , and then drag the Air gesture switch to the right.



The device may not recognize your gestures if you perform them too far from the device or while wearing dark-coloured clothes, such as gloves.

### **Quick glance**


When the screen is turned off, move your hand above the sensor to view notifications, missed calls, new messages, time and date, and more.


### Air jump

While viewing emails or webpages, move your hand up or down across the sensor to scroll the page up or down.



### Air browse

Move your hand to the left or right across the sensor to browse images, webpages, songs, or memos.



### Air call-accept


When a call comes in, move your hand to the left, and then to the right across the sensor to answer the call.



# Using the S Pen

The included S Pen can be used to easily select items or perform functions. Actions using the S Pen with the button pressed provide additional conveniences, such as screen capture.

Pull out the S Pen from the slot to use it.



When you pull out the S Pen from the slot, the device detects it and performs the following:

- Turns on the touch screen (if it is off).
- Launches action memo, or display general air commands (during a call).




- The pen nib of the S Pen is replaceable. If the pen nib gets dull, replace it with a new one.
- If the S Pen is not working properly, take it to a Samsung Service Centre. Refer to the Samsung website for more information about the S Pen.
- For best results, keep the S Pen mostly perpendicular to the touch screen and avoid using it at sharp angles.
- The Menu button and the Back button cannot be activated by the S Pen.

### Air command

Press the S Pen button while hovering the S Pen over the screen to display air command. With this feature, you can directly use the following actions:

- Action Memo: Write a memo, and then select it by drawing a line around it to take actions related to the memo.
- Scrapbooker: Collect a variety of content and save it in Scrapbook. (p. 135)
- Screen Write: Capture a screenshot and edit it.
- **S Finder**: Search for a wide variety of content on your device. (p. 133)
- Pen Window: Launch multiple applications in specified areas on the screen.



#### Making a simple memo

Tap **Action Memo** on the air command. Alternatively, with the S Pen button pressed, double-tap the screen. Jot down or draw a memo, and then select the memo by tapping to perform various actions, such as making a call, adding contacts, sending messages.

With selected, draw a line around an area with the S Pen to perform actions with the selected area.

### **Capturing screenshots**

Tap **Screen Write** on the air command. Alternatively, with the S Pen button pressed, touch the screen until you hear a click. It is possible to draw or write on or to crop a screenshot.

The screenshot is saved in the **Gallery**  $\rightarrow$  **Screenshots** folder.

It is not possible to capture a screenshot while using some applications.


### Launching multiple applications

Tap **Pen Window** on the air commands. Draw a line around an area, and then select an application. The application is launched in the area that you have drawn. To minimise the application, tap \_\_\_. Minimised applications are always displayed on top.

To close the applications, tap  $\times$ .

### Opening available options

Some items have contextual menus that make the S Pen pointer glow. Press the S Pen button to display the menu while hovering the S Pen over the item.




### Selecting and capturing an image

With the S Pen button pressed, draw a line around an area to select it.

If necessary, use one of the following options:

- O: Convert the selection to circular shape.
- [[]]: Convert the selection to rectangular shape.
- 🏠 : Customize the selection.

Select an application to use with the selected area from the icons that appear at the bottom of the screen.



# S Pen Keeper

When the touch screen is off and S Pen is removed from the device, the device displays a pop-up alert and emits a sound if you walk. Access the S Pen settings to activate or deactivate the feature.

### Air view

Use this feature to perform various functions while the S Pen or your finger is hovering over the screen.

On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls \rightarrow Air view$ , and then drag the Air view switch to the right.


Point at an item with the S Pen or your finger to preview content or view information in a pop-up window.

You can scroll through panels or lists by moving the S Pen pointer to an edge (top/bottom/left/right) of the screen.





When you point at an area on a webpage for a few seconds with your finger, the device magnifies the area.






## **Samsung Smart Pause**

Use this feature to pause videos when you look away from the screen.

On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls \rightarrow Smart screen$ , and then tick Smart pause.

During video playback, look away from the screen to pause the video. To resume playback, look at the screen again.




## Samsung Smart Scroll

Use this feature to scroll the screen up or down by tilting your head or the device.

On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls \rightarrow Smart screen \rightarrow Smart scroll,$  and then drag the Smart scroll switch to the right. Tap Smart scroll, and then select a scroll type.

When you are viewing emails or webpages, the scroll type icon ( for head orientation or for tilting the device) that shows the recognition status for movements appears in blue.

When the device recognizes your head or device's movements, the icon turns green. Tilt your head downward or upward, or tilt the device forward or backward to scroll in that direction.



## Adjusting touch screen sensitivity

Use this feature to let the device adjust its touch sensitivity automatically.

On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls$ , and then tick Increase touch sensitivity.



- Use leather gloves for better recognition while touching the screen. Other types of material may not be recognized.
- For best results, tap the screen firmly while wearing gloves.

## **Activating Multi Window**

Use this feature to run two applications on the screen at the same time.




- Only applications on the Multi Window panel can run.
- When launching applications that contain multimedia files, such as music or videos, sound from both files will be played.
- This feature may not be available depending on the region or service provider.

To use Multi Window, on the Applications screen, tap **Settings** → **Device**, and then tick **Multi** window.

### Using the Multi Window panel

To show the Multi Window panel, tap and hold . The Multi Window panel appears at the left side of the screen. Select one application, and then drag another application to a new location. You can launch the same application on the two windows at the same time. To hide the Multi Window panel, tap and hold . again.





Drag the circle between the application panels up or down to adjust the size of the panels.

Tap the panel handle to hide or show the panel. When a panel is open, tap and hold the handle and drag it to the left or right edge of the screen to move the panel. When a panel is hidden, tap and hold the handle and drag it up or down to move the handle.

### **Using Multi Window applications**

While using Multi Window applications, select an application panel, tap the circle between the application panels, and then use one of the following:

- 🛅 : Switch locations between Multi Window applications.
- Share items between the application windows. Drag an item to share from one window to another. Some applications may not support this feature.
- X: Close the application.

#### **Sharing files**

Drag an item you want to share to the other window to share the item from one window to another. Some applications may not support this feature.

#### Creating a paired window

Use this feature to save the combination of current running Multi Window applications. On the Multi Window panel, tap  $\longrightarrow$  Create, enter a title, and then tap **OK**.

### **Notifications**

Notification icons appear on the status bar at the top of the screen to report missed calls, new messages, calendar events, device status, and more. Drag down from the status bar to open the notifications panel. Scroll the list to see additional alerts. To close the notifications panel, drag up the bar that is at the bottom of the screen.

From the notifications panel, you can view your device's current settings. Drag down from the status bar, tap  $\blacksquare$  to use the following options:

- Wi-Fi: Activate or deactivate the Wi-Fi feature.
- **GPS**: Activate or deactivate the GPS feature.
- Sound: Activate or deactivate silent mode. You can vibrate or mute your device in silent mode.
- Screen rotation: Allow or prevent the interface from rotating when you rotate the device.
- Bluetooth: Activate or deactivate the Bluetooth feature.
- Reading mode: Activate or deactivate reading mode. In reading mode, the device helps protect your eyes when reading at night. To select which applications will be used for, tap Settings 

  Device 

  Display 

  Reading mode.
- Blocking mode: Activate or deactivate blocking mode. In blocking mode, your device
  will block notifications. To select which notifications will be blocked, tap Settings →
  Device → Blocking mode.
- Power saving: Activate or deactivate power-saving mode.
- Multi window: Set to use Multi Window.
- Screen Mirroring: Activate or deactivate the screen mirroring feature.
- **Wi-Fi hotspot**: Activate or deactivate the Wi-Fi tethering feature.
- S Beam: Activate or deactivate the S Beam feature.
- NFC: Activate or deactivate the NFC feature.
- Air view: Activate or deactivate the air view feature.
- Air gesture: Activate or deactivate the air gesture feature.
- Hands-free mode: Activate or deactivate hands-free mode.
- Smart stay: Activate or deactivate the smart stay feature.
- Smart pause: Activate or deactivate the smart pause feature.
- Smart scroll: Activate or deactivate the smart scroll feature.
- Sync: Activate or deactivate auto-syncing of applications.
- Flight mode: Activate or deactivate flight mode.

**Basics** 



The available options may vary depending on the region or service provider.

To rearrange the options on the notifications panel, open the notifications panel, tap **and** hold an item, and then drag the item to another location.

### Home screen

The Home screen is the starting point to access all of the device's features. It displays indicator icons, widgets, shortcuts to applications, and others.

The Home screen can have multiple panels. To view other panels, scroll left or right.

### Changing the Home screen mode

The Home screen has standard and easy modes. In easy mode, you can easily access your favourite contacts, applications, and settings by adding shortcuts to the Home screen.

To switch to easy mode, on the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Device \rightarrow Easy mode$ , and then drag the Easy mode switch to the right.

### Rearranging items

#### Adding an application icon

On the Home screen, tap **Apps**, tap and hold an application icon, and then drag it into a panel preview. Put it on a location you want, resize it by dragging the frame if necessary, and then tap anywhere on the screen to save the location of the widget.

#### Adding an item

Customize the Home screen by adding widgets, folders, or panels.

Tap and hold the empty area on the Home screen, and then select one of the following categories:

- Apps and widgets: Add widgets or applications to the Home screen.
- Folder: Create a new folder.
- Page: Rearrange panels on the Home screen.

**Basics** 

#### Moving an item

Tap and hold an item and drag it to a new location. To move it to another panel, drag it to the side of the screen.

#### Removing an item

Tap and hold an item, and drag it to the rubbish bin that appears at the top of the Home screen. When the rubbish bin turns red, release the item.

### Rearranging panels

#### Adding a new panel

Tap  $\longrightarrow$  Edit page  $\rightarrow$   $\blacksquare$ .

#### Moving a panel

Tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Edit page, tap and hold a panel preview, and then drag it to a new location.

#### Removing a panel

Tap  $\Longrightarrow$  **Edit page**, tap and hold a panel preview, and then drag it to the rubbish bin at the top of the screen.

### Setting wallpaper

Set an image or photo stored in the device as wallpaper for the Home screen.

On the Home screen, tap  $\blacksquare \to$  **Set wallpaper**  $\to$  **Home screen**, and then select one of the following:

- **Gallery**: See photos taken by the device's camera or images downloaded from the Internet.
- Live wallpapers: See animated images.
- Wallpapers: See wallpaper images.

Then, select an image and tap **Set wallpaper**. Or, select an image, resize it by dragging the frame, and then tap **Done**.

### **Using widgets**

Widgets are small applications that provide convenient functions and information on your Home screen. To use them, add widgets from the widgets panel to the Home screen.



- Some widgets connect to web services. Using a web-based widget may result in additional charges.
- The widgets available may vary depending on the region or service provider.

#### Adding widgets to the Home screen

On the Home screen, tap  $Apps \rightarrow Widgets$ . Scroll left or right on the widgets panel, and then tap and hold a widget to add it to the Home screen.

### Locked screen

The locked screen prevents the device from unwanted operation when not in use and also allows you to add convenient widgets.

### Locking and unlocking the device

Pressing the Power button turns off the screen and puts the device into lock mode. The device automatically gets locked if it is not used for a specified period.

To unlock the device, press the Power button or the Home button and flick your finger in any direction within the unlock screen area at the lower part of the screen.

### **Adding widgets**

To use widgets when the screen is locked, on the Applications screen, tap **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Device**  $\rightarrow$  **Lock screen**  $\rightarrow$  **Multiple widgets** and then drag the **Multiple widgets** switch to the right.



You cannot use widgets on the locked screen in easy mode.

Drag the widgets panel down to expand it. Scroll right to the last page, tap  $\Box$ , and then select a widget to add to the locked screen.



### **Rearranging panels**

#### Moving a panel

Drag the widgets panel down, scroll left or right, tap and hold a panel preview, and then drag it to a new location.

#### Removing a panel

Drag the widgets panel down, scroll left or right, tap and hold a panel preview, and then drag it to the rubbish bin at the top of the screen.

## **Using applications**

This device can run many different types of applications, ranging from media to Internet applications.

### Opening an application

On the Home screen or the Applications screen, select an application icon to open it.



Some applications may not be visible on the Applications screen as they are stored in folders.

### Opening from recently-used applications

Press and hold the Home button to open the list of recently-used applications.

Select an application icon to open.

### Closing an application

Close applications not in use to save battery power and maintain device performance.

Press and hold the Home button, tap , and then tap **End** next to an application to close it. To close all running applications, tap **End all**. Alternatively, press and hold the Home button, and then tap .

## **Applications screen**

The Applications screen displays icons for all applications, including any new applications installed.

On the Home screen, tap Apps to open the Applications screen.

To view other panels, scroll left or right.

### Rearranging applications

Tap  $\Longrightarrow$  **Edit**, tap and hold an application, and then drag it to a new location. To move it to another panel, drag it to the side of the screen.

### Organizing with folders

Put related applications together in a folder for convenience.

Tap  $\implies$  Edit, tap and hold an application, and then drag it to Create folder. Enter a folder name and then tap **OK**. Put applications into the new folder by dragging, and then tap **Save** to save the arrangement.

### Rearranging panels

Pinch on the screen, tap and hold a panel preview, and then drag it to a new location.

### **Installing applications**

Use application stores, such as **Samsung Apps**, to download and install applications.

### **Uninstalling applications**

Tap  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  Uninstall/disable apps, and then select an application to uninstall it.



Default applications that come with the device cannot be uninstalled.

## Help

Access help information to learn how to use the device and applications or configure important settings.

Tap **Help** on the Applications screen. Select a category to view tips.

To sort categories by an alphabetical order, tap ===.

To search for keywords, tap  $\square$ .

## One-handed operation

You can activate one-handed operation mode for your convenience. In this mode, application interfaces are modified for easy use with one hand.

On the Applications screen, tap **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Controls**  $\rightarrow$  **One-handed operation**. Tick applications or features to use with the mode.

## **Entering text**


Use the Samsung keyboard or the voice input feature to enter text.



Text entry is not supported in some languages. To enter text, you must change the input language to one of the supported languages.

### Changing the keyboard type

Tap any text field, open the notifications panel, tap **Select input method**, and then select the type of keyboard to use.



#### **Entering uppercase**

Tap before entering a character. For all caps, tap it twice.

#### Changing the keyboard type

Tap and hold **1**, and then tap **1** to change the keyboard type.


#### Changing language keyboards

Add languages to the keyboard, and then slide the space key left or right to change language keyboards.

#### **Handwriting**

Tap , and then write a word with a finger or the S Pen. Suggested words appear as characters are entered. Select a suggested word.

**Basics** 



Use handwriting gestures to perform actions, such as editing or deleting characters and inserting spaces. To view the gesture guides, tap and hold  $\mathbb{T}$ , and then tap  $\clubsuit \to \mathsf{Help} \to \mathsf{Use}$  handwriting gestures.


#### Direct pen input

On the Applications screen, tap Settings  $\rightarrow$  Controls  $\rightarrow$  S Pen  $\rightarrow$  Direct pen input, and then drag the Direct pen input switch to the right.

When hovering the S Pen over a text field, icon appears at the upper left corner of the text field. Tap it to write with the S Pen. To make simple corrections, change input languages, or enter a space between characters, tap each correction tool displayed on the handwriting pad.

When this feature is enabled, you can do the following actions:

- Send a handwritten message.
- Make a call by writing a contact name or a phone number on the keypad.
- Set an alarm just by writing numbers.



### **Entering text by voice**

Activate the voice input feature and then speak into the microphone. The device displays what you speak.

If the device does not recognize your words, tap the underlined text and select an alternative word or phrase from the dropdown list.

To change the language or add languages for voice recognition, tap the current language.

### Copying and pasting

Tap and hold over text, drag or to select more or less text, and then tap **Copy** to copy or **Cut** to cut. The selected text is copied to the clipboard.

To paste it into a text entry field, tap and hold at the point where it should be inserted, and then tap **Paste**.

## Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

Connect the device to a Wi-Fi network to use the Internet or share media files with other devices. (p. 140)

### Turning Wi-Fi on and off

Open the notifications panel, and then tap Wi-Fi to turn it on or off.



• Turn off Wi-Fi to save the battery when not in use.

### Joining Wi-Fi networks

On the Applications screen, tap **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Connections**  $\rightarrow$  **Wi-Fi**, and then drag the **Wi-Fi** switch to the right.

Select a network from the list of detected Wi-Fi networks, enter a password if necessary, and then tap **Connect**. Networks that require a password appear with a lock icon. After the device connects to a Wi-Fi network, the device will automatically connect to it any time it is available.

### **Adding Wi-Fi networks**

If the desired network does not appear in the networks list, tap **Add Wi-Fi network** at the bottom of the networks list. Enter the network name in **Network SSID**, select the security type and enter the password if it is not an open network, and then tap **Connect**.

### Forgetting Wi-Fi networks

Any network that has ever been used, including the current network, can be forgotten so the device will not automatically connect to it. Select the network in the networks list, and then tap **Forget**.

## Setting up accounts

Google applications, such as **Play Store**, require a Google account, and **Samsung Apps** requires a Samsung account. Create Google and Samsung accounts to have the best experience with the device.

### **Adding accounts**

Follow the instructions that appear when opening a Google application without signing in to set up a Google account.

To sign in with or sign up for a Google account, on the Applications screen, tap **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **General**  $\rightarrow$  **Accounts**  $\rightarrow$  **Add account**  $\rightarrow$  **Google**. After that, tap **New** to sign up, or tap **Existing**, and then follow on-screen instructions to complete the account setup. More than one Google account can be used on the device.

Set up a Samsung account as well.

### **Removing accounts**

On the Applications screen, tap **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **General**, select an account name under **Accounts**, select the account to remove, and then tap **Remove account**.

## **Transferring files**

Move audio, video, image, or other types of files from the device to the computer, or vice versa.



- The following file formats are supported by some applications. Some file formats are not supported depending on the version of the device's software or the computer operating system.
  - Music: mp3, m4a, mp4, 3gp, 3ga, wma, ogg, oga, aac, and flac
  - Image: bmp, gif, jpg, and png
  - Video: avi, wmv, asf, flv, mkv, mp4, 3gp, webm, and ts
  - Document: doc, docx, xls, xlsx, ppt, pptx, pdf, and txt
- Some file formats, such as AC3, are not supported. To play these files, install an application which supports them.



• USB 3.0 speeds up data transfers, but it may sometimes interfere with calls or data when it is in use. It will turn off automatically after 10 minutes if it is not being used, and your connection will switch to using USB 2.0.

### **Connecting with Samsung Kies**

Samsung Kies is a computer application that manages media contents and personal information with Samsung devices. Download the latest Samsung Kies from the Samsung website.

- 1 Connect the device to the computer using the USB cable.

  Samsung Kies launches on the computer automatically. If Samsung Kies does not launch, double-click the Samsung Kies icon on the computer.
- 2 Transfer files between your device and the computer. Refer to the Samsung Kies help for more information.

### **Connecting with Windows Media Player**

Ensure that Windows Media Player is installed on the computer.

1 Connect the device to the computer using the USB cable.

2 Open Windows Media Player and sync music files.

### Connecting as a media device

- 1 Connect the device to the computer using the USB cable.
- Open the notifications panel, and then tap Connected as a media device → Media device (MTP).

Tap **Camera (PTP)** if your computer does not support Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) or not have any appropriate driver installed.

3 Transfer files between your device and the computer.

## Securing the device

Prevent others from using or accessing personal data and information stored in the device by using the security features. The device requires an unlock code whenever unlocking it.

### Setting a signature

On the Applications screen, tap Settings  $\rightarrow$  Device  $\rightarrow$  Lock screen  $\rightarrow$  Screen lock  $\rightarrow$  Signature.

Draw your signature, and then draw the signature two more times to verify it. Set a backup unlock PIN to unlock the screen when you forget the signature.




**Note**: Use of the S Pen is required to unlock the device using your signature.

**Basics** 

### Setting a pattern

On the Applications screen, tap Settings  $\rightarrow$  Device  $\rightarrow$  Lock screen  $\rightarrow$  Screen lock  $\rightarrow$  Pattern.

Draw a pattern by connecting four dots or more, and then draw the pattern again to verify it. Set a backup unlock PIN to unlock the screen when you forget the pattern.



### **Setting a PIN**

On the Applications screen, tap Settings  $\rightarrow$  Device  $\rightarrow$  Lock screen  $\rightarrow$  Screen lock  $\rightarrow$  PIN. Enter at least four numbers, and then enter the password again to verify it.

### Setting a password

On the Applications screen, tap Settings  $\rightarrow$  Device  $\rightarrow$  Lock screen  $\rightarrow$  Screen lock  $\rightarrow$  Password.

Enter at least four characters including numbers and symbols, and then enter the password again to verify it.

### Unlocking the device

Turn on the screen by pressing the Power button or the Home button, and enter the unlock code.



If the unlock code is forgotten, take the device to a Samsung Service Centre to reset it.

## **Upgrading the device**

The device can be upgraded to the latest software.



This feature may not be available depending on the region or service provider.

### **Upgrading with Samsung Kies**

Launch Samsung Kies and connect the device to the computer. Samsung Kies automatically recognizes the device and shows available updates in a dialogue box, if any. Click the Update button in the dialogue box to start upgrading. Refer to the Samsung Kies help for details on how to upgrade.



- Do not turn off the computer or disconnect the USB cable while the device is upgrading.
- While upgrading the device, do not connect other media devices to the computer.
   Doing so may interfere with the update process.

### Upgrading over the air

The device can be directly upgraded to the latest software by the firmware over-the-air (FOTA) service.

On the Applications screen, tap Settings  $\rightarrow$  General  $\rightarrow$  About device  $\rightarrow$  Software update  $\rightarrow$  Update.

### **Phone**

Use this application to make or answer a call.

Tap **Phone** on the Applications screen.

### **Making calls**

#### Making a call

Use one of the following methods:


- Keypad: Enter the number using the keypad, and then tap
- Logs: Make a call from the history of incoming and outgoing calls and messages.
- Favourites: Make a call from the list of favourite contacts.
- Contacts: Make a call from the contacts list.

#### **Speed dial numbers**

For speed dial numbers, tap and hold the corresponding digit.

#### **Number prediction**

When entering numbers on the keypad, automatic predictions appear. Select one of these to make a call.



#### **Finding contacts**

Enter a name, phone number, or email address to find a contact in the contacts list. As characters are entered, predicted contacts appear. Select one to place a call to it.

#### Making an international call

Tap and hold **0** until the + sign appears. Enter the country code, area code, and phone number, and then tap **\lambda**.

#### **During a call**

The following actions are available:

- 📠 : Select an equalizer option for use during a call.
- Note: Deactivate the noise reduction feature that removes background noise so that the other party can hear you more clearly.
- **Increase the volume.**
- Hold: Hold a call. Tap Unhold to retrieve the held call.
- Add call: Dial a second call.
- Keypad: Open the keypad.
- End call: End the current call.
- **Speaker**: Activate the speakerphone. Keep the device away from your ears when using the speakerphone.
- Mute: Turn off the microphone so that the other party cannot hear you.
- **Headset**: Switch to a Bluetooth headset if it is connected to the device.
- Swap: Switch between two calls.
- Merge: Make a multiparty call when connected to two calls. Repeat this to add more parties. This feature is available only if the multiparty call service is active.

- $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  **Contacts**: Open the contacts list.
- **□** → **Action Memo**: Launch action memo.
- $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Message: Send a message.
- **□** → **Transfer**: Transfer call to another caller.
- □ → One-handed operation on: Moves the phone keys to the side to allow one-handed operation.

#### **Adding contacts**

To add a phone number to the contacts list from the keypad, enter the number and tap **Add** to contacts.

### Viewing call logs

Tap **Logs** to view the history of incoming and outgoing calls.

To filter a call log, tap  $\rightleftharpoons$   $\rightarrow$  **View**, and then select an option.

#### Fixed dialing numbers

The device can be set to restrict outgoing calls only to numbers with specified prefixes. Those prefixes are stored in the SIM card.

Tap  $\implies$  Call settings  $\rightarrow$  Additional settings  $\rightarrow$  Fixed Dialling Numbers  $\rightarrow$  Enable FDN, and then enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM or USIM card. Tap FDN list and add numbers.

#### **Call barring**

The device can be set to prevent certain calls from being made. For example, international calling can be disabled.

Tap  $\blacksquare \to \textbf{Call settings} \to \textbf{Additional settings} \to \textbf{Call barring}$ , select a call type, select a call barring option, and then enter a password.

### **Receiving calls**

#### Answering a call

When a call comes in, drag \ outside the large circle.

If the call waiting service is active, another call can be made. When the second call is answered, the first call is put on hold.

#### Rejecting a call

When a call comes in, drag a outside the large circle.

To send a message when rejecting an incoming call, drag the reject message bar upwards. To create the rejection message, tap  $\equiv \rightarrow$  Call settings  $\rightarrow$  Set up call reject messages.

#### Automatically rejecting calls from unwanted numbers

Tap  $\implies$  Call settings  $\rightarrow$  Call rejection  $\rightarrow$  Auto reject mode  $\rightarrow$  Auto reject numbers, and then tap Auto reject list. Tap Create, enter a number, assign a category, and then tap Save.

#### Missed calls

If a call is missed, appears on the status bar. Open the notifications panel to view the list of missed calls.

#### **Call waiting**

Call waiting is a service provided by the service provider. A user can use this service to suspend a current call and switch to an incoming call.

To make use of this service, tap  $\blacksquare \to \textbf{Call settings} \to \textbf{Additional settings}$ , and then tick Call waiting.

#### **Call forwarding**

The device can be set to send incoming calls to a specified number.

Tap  $\blacksquare \to \textbf{Call settings} \to \textbf{Additional settings} \to \textbf{Call forwarding}$ , and then select a call type and condition. Enter a number and tap **Enable**.

### **Contacts**

Use this application to manage contacts, including phone numbers, email addresses, and others.

Tap **Contacts** on the Applications screen.

### **Managing contacts**

Tap Contacts.

#### **Creating a contact**

Tap + and enter contact information.

- Add an image.
- 📵 / 📵 : Add or delete a contact field.

#### **Editing a contact**

Select a contact to edit, and then tap .

#### **Deleting a contact**

Tap  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  **Delete**.

#### Setting a speed dial number

Tap **□** → **Speed dial setting**, select a speed dial number, and then select a contact for it. To remove a speed dial number, tap and hold it, and then tap **Remove**.

### **Searching for contacts**

#### Tap Contacts.

Use one of the following search methods:

- Scroll up or down the contacts list.
- Use the index at the right side of the contacts list for quick scrolling, by dragging a finger along it.
- Tap the search field at the top of the contacts list and enter search criteria.

Once a contact is selected, take one of the following actions:

- ★ : Add to favourite contacts.
- Make a voice call.
- K: Compose a message.
- **≥** : Compose an email.

### **Displaying contacts**

#### Tap Contacts.

By default, the device shows all saved contacts.

Tap  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  Contacts to display, and then select a location where contacts are saved.

### **Moving contacts**

Tap Contacts.

#### Moving contacts to Google

Tap  $\Longrightarrow$  Merge accounts  $\rightarrow$  Merge with Google.

Contacts moved to Google Contacts appear with <a> in the contacts list.</a>

#### Moving contacts to Samsung

Tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Merge accounts  $\rightarrow$  Merge with Samsung.

Contacts moved to Samsung Contacts appear with <a> in the contacts list</a>.

### Importing and exporting contacts

Tap Contacts.

#### **Importing contacts**

Tap □ → Import/Export → Import from SIM card, Import from SD card, or Import from USB storage.

#### **Exporting contacts**

Tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Import/Export  $\rightarrow$  Export to SIM card, Export to SD card, or Export to USB storage.

#### **Sharing contacts**

Tap  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  Share namecard via, select contacts, tap Done, and then select a sharing method.

#### **Favourite contacts**

#### Tap Favourites.

Tap = , and then take one of the following actions:

- Search: Search for contacts.
- Add to favourites: Add contacts to favourites.
- Remove from favourites: Remove contacts from favourites.
- Grid view / List view: View contacts in grid or list form.
- **Help**: Access help information about using contacts.

### **Contact groups**

Tap **Groups**.

#### Adding contacts to a group

Select a group, and then tap +. Select contacts to add, and then tap **Done**.

#### Managing groups

Tap = , and then take one of the following actions:

- Create: Make a new group.
- Search: Search for contacts.
- Change order: Tap and hold in next to the group name, drag it up or down to another position, and then tap Done.
- **Delete groups**: Select user-added groups, and then tap **Delete**. Default groups cannot be deleted.
- Help: Access help information about using contacts.

#### Sending a message or email to a group's members

Select a group, tap  $\implies$  Send message or Send email, select members, and then tap **Done**.

#### **Business card**

Tap Contacts.

Create a business card and send it to others.

Tap **Set up my profile**, enter details, such as phone number, email address, and postal address, and then tap **Save**. If user information has been saved when you set up the device, select the business card in **ME**, and then tap **\sum\_** to edit.

Tap  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  **Share namecard via**, and then select a sharing method.

## Messages

Use this application to send text messages (SMS) or multimedia messages (MMS).

Tap Messages on the Applications screen.



You may incur additional charges for sending or receiving messages while you are outside your home service area. For details, contact your service provider.

### Sending messages

Tap **☑**, add recipients, enter a message, and then tap **☑**.

Use the following methods to add recipients:

- Enter a phone number.
- Tap **1**, select contacts, and then tap **Done**.
- Hover the S Pen over , and then press the S Pen button. Recently-used contacts list appears.

Use the following methods to make a multimedia message:

- Tap Ø and attach images, videos, contacts, notes, events, and others.
- Tap 

  Add subject to enter a subject.
- Hover the S Pen over ∅, and then press the S Pen button. Recently-added images appear.

### Sending handwritten messages

When hovering the S Pen over a text field,  $\square$  icon appears at the upper left corner of the text field. Tap  $\square$ , and tap  $\angle$  to enter a handwritten message with the S Pen.

### Sending scheduled messages

While composing a message, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  **Scheduling**. Set a time and date, and then tap **Done**. The device will send the message at the specified time and date.

- This feature is based on the time and date set on the device. The time and date

In any mailbox, tap , enter recipients, a subject, and a message, and then tap .

Tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Attach picture to attach images.

Tap  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  **Attach video** to attach videos.

Tap  $\longrightarrow$  Add Cc/Bcc to add more recipients.

Tap  $\Longrightarrow$  Save draft to save the message for later delivery.



Use this application to chat with others.

Tap **Google** → **Hangouts** on the Applications screen.

Select a friend from the friends list or enter data to search and select a friend from the results to start chatting.

### **ChatON**

Use this application to chat with any device. To use this application, you must sign in to your Samsung account and verify your phone number.

Tap **ChatON** on the Applications screen.



This application may not be available depending on the region or service provider.

Create a buddies list by entering phone numbers or Samsung account email addresses, or by selecting buddies from the list of suggestions. Alternatively, tap  $\equiv \rightarrow$  Contact sync to manually sync contacts from the device.

Tap  $\longrightarrow$  **Start chat** and select a buddy to start chatting.

To switch to voice or video chat, tap **□** → **ChatON Voice Chat** or **ChatON Video Chat**.

Use this application to search for information and browse webpages.

Tap **Google** → **Chrome** on the Applications screen.

Tap the address field, and then enter a web address or search criteria.

### Opening a new page

Tap  $\square$   $\rightarrow$  New tab.

To go to another webpage, tap  $\boxed{2} \rightarrow$  a webpage.

#### Searching the web by voice

Tap the address field, tap ♥, speak a keyword, and then select one of the suggested keywords that appear.

#### Syncing with other devices

Sync open tabs and bookmarks to use with Chrome on another device, when you are logged in with the same Google account.

To view open tabs on other devices, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Other devices. Select a webpage to open.

To view bookmarks, tap ★.



Set whether or not to require a group password.

#### **Creating a group for Group Play**

When you create a Group Play session, other devices can join the session and share the content.

When you use a password for a Group Play session, other devices must enter the password to join the session. To use a password, tick **Set group password**.

Tap Create group, set a password, and then use the following features:

- Share music: Connect two or more devices and use them to achieve a surround sound effect when sharing music.
- Share pictures: Select images to share.
- Share video: Connect two or more devices to share a video or combine the devices into a larger display. Each device displays parts of the video at the same time, which can be played together, to create a large display showing the whole video. To activate this feature, tap while sharing a video.
- Share documents: Select documents to share.
- Play games and more: Play online games with friends.



## Connecting to a TV

Connect to a TV to display the device's screen onto a large surface and control the TV remotely with the device.

## Music

Use this application to listen to music.

Tap Music on the Applications screen.



## **Playing music**

Select a music category, and then select a song to play.

Tap the album image at the bottom of the screen to open the music player screen.



Media

To listen to songs at equal volume levels, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Smart volume.



When **Smart volume** is activated, the volume may end up louder than the device volume level. Use caution to avoid long-term exposure to loud sounds to prevent damage to your hearing.

To set a personalized sound while listening to songs with a headset, tap  $\implies$  **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Adapt Sound**  $\rightarrow$  **On**. When you turn the volume up to level 14 or higher, the adapt sound option is not applied to music playback. If you turn the volume down to level 13 or lower, the option is reapplied.

#### Setting a song as ringtone

To use the currently-playing song as ringtone, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Set as  $\rightarrow$  Phone ringtone.

#### Listening to a song with others

To share the currently-playing song with others, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Play via Group Play.

#### **Creating playlists**

Make an own selection of songs.

Tap **Playlists**, and then tap  $\longrightarrow$  **Create playlist**. Enter a title and tap **OK**. Tap **Add music**, select songs to include, and then tap **Done**.

To add the currently-playing song to a playlist, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow Add$  to playlist.

## Playing music by mood

Play music grouped by mood. The playlist is automatically created by the device.

Tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Music menu, and tick Music square, and then tap Done.

Tap **Music square** at the top of the screen, and select a cell of mood. Or select multiple cells by dragging your finger.

#### **Camera**

Use this application to take photos or videos.

Use Gallery to view photos and videos taken with the device's camera. (p. 90)

Tap Camera on the Applications screen.



- The camera automatically shuts off when unused.
- Make sure that the lens is clean. Otherwise, the device may not work properly in some modes that require high resolutions.


#### Camera etiquette

- Do not take photos or videos of other people without their permission.
- Do not take photos or videos where legally prohibited.
- Do not take photos or videos in places where you may violate other people's privacy.

#### **Taking photos**

#### Taking a photo

Tap the image on the preview screen where the camera should focus. When the subject is in focus, the focus frame turns green. Tap to take the photo.



#### **Shooting mode**

Several photo effects are available.

Tap MODE, and then scroll up or down the screen at the right side of the screen.

- Auto: Use this to allow the camera to evaluate the surroundings and determine the ideal mode for the photo.
- Beauty face: Take a photo with lightened faces for gentler images.
- **Best photo**: Take a series of photos, and then save the best one.
- Best face: Use this to take multiple group shots at the same time and combine them to create the best possible image.
  - Tap to take multiple photos. To get the best shot, hold the camera steady and remain still while taking photos. When **Gallery** opens, tap the yellow frame on each face, and choose the best individual pose for the subject. After choosing a pose for each individual, tap to merge the images into a single photo, and save it.
- Sound & shot: Use this to take a photo with sound.
  - Tap to take a photo. The device records a few seconds of audio after taking a photo.



While taking photos in this mode, sound is recorded by the internal microphone.

• **Drama**: Use this to take a series of photos and combine them to create an image that shows trails of the movement.

To get the best shot, follow these tips. The device may not take photos properly in other shooting conditions.

- Hold the camera steady and remain still while taking photos.
- Take photos of a subject that is moving in one direction.
- Take photos with backgrounds that are free of moving objects.
- Avoid taking photos of a subject and background with similar colours.
- Avoid taking photos of a subject that is too close or too far away to fit within the viewfinder or that is too long such as a bus or a train.

- Animated photo: Use this to create animated photos from a video.
- **Golf**: Use this setting to take a radial image of a complete golf swing, combining several images together to make one composite view.
- Rich tone (HDR): Use this to take photos without losing details in bright and dark areas.
- Eraser: Use this to erase the movements of moving subjects in the background.

Tap to take a series of photos. The device erases traces of movement from a moving subject. To restore the original photo, tap , and then tap the highlighted area.

To get the best shot, follow these tips.

- Hold the camera steady and remain still while taking photos.
- When taking photos of an object and background with similar colours, the camera may not recognize all of the movement.
- When taking photos of a subject that is moving very little or moving a great deal, the camera may not recognize all of the movements.
- If there are multiple subjects moving in the background, the camera may not recognize all of the movement.
- Panorama: Take a photo composed of many photos strung together.

To get the best shot, follow these tips.

- Move the camera slowly in one direction.
- Keep the camera's viewfinder within the guide frame.
- Avoid taking photos of a subject in front of unrecognisable backgrounds, such as empty skies or plain walls.
- Surround shot: Use this to take a 360-degree panoramic photo.
- **Sports**: Use this setting for fast-moving subjects.

#### **Panoramic photos**

A panoramic photo is a wide landscape image consisting of multiple shots.

Tap **MODE** → **Panorama**.

Tap and move the camera in one direction. When the blue frame aligns with the viewfinder, the camera automatically takes another shot in a panoramic sequence. To stop shooting, tap .

If the viewfinder is out of the direction, the device stops shooting.

#### **Applying filter effects**

Use the filter effects to take unique photos or videos.

Tap and select a filter effect. The available options vary by mode.

## **Taking videos**

#### Taking a video

Tap to take a video. To pause recording, tap . To stop recording, tap . Press the Shutter button to take photos while taking a video.



While recording, use the following actions:


- To change the focus, tap where you want to focus. To focus on the centre of the screen, tap .

#### **Recording mode**

Tap  $\Rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$   $\Rightarrow$  to change the recording mode.

- Normal: Use this mode for normal quality.
- Limit for MMS: Use this mode to lower quality for sending via messages.
- Slow motion: Use this mode to take a video of a moving subject. The device will play the video in slow motion.
- Fast motion: Use this mode to take a video of a moving subject. The device will play the video in fast motion.
- Smooth motion: Use this mode to take a video of a moving subject. The device will play
  the video in high quality.

#### Zooming in and out



Use one of the following methods:

- Use the Volume button to zoom in or out.
- Spread two fingers apart on the screen to zoom in, and pinch to zoom out.



The zoom in/out effect is available when using the zoom feature while shooting video.

#### **Dual Camera mode**

When you take a landscape photo with the rear camera, the photo or video captured by the front camera appears in an inset window, or vice versa. Use this feature to take a beautiful landscape photo and a self-portrait simultaneously.

Tap 🚮 to switch to dual camera mode. Tap 💽 to take a photo or tap 💽 to take a video.



Select among various styles that are available.



- You can record videos in dual camera mode for up to 5 minutes in Full HD and up to 10 minutes in HD.
- While taking videos in this mode, sound is recorded by the internal microphone.

#### Share shot

Tap  $\Longrightarrow$   $\longrightarrow$   $\Longrightarrow$ , and then select one of the following:

- Share shot: Send a photo directly to another device via Wi-Fi Direct or NFC.
- **Buddy photo share**: Set the device to recognize a person's face that you have tagged in a photo and send it to that person.
- **Remote viewfinder**: Set a device to control the camera remotely.

## Controlling the camera remotely

Set a device as a viewfinder to control the camera remotely.

Tap  $\longrightarrow$  Remote viewfinder, and then connect the device and the camera using Wi-Fi Direct or NFC. Tap  $\bigcirc$  to take a photo remotely using the device as a viewfinder.

#### **Configuring settings for Camera**

Tap  $\Longrightarrow \to \bigstar$  to configure settings for Camera. Not all of the following options are available in both still camera and video camera modes. The available options vary depending on the mode used.

- Photo size / Video size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. But it takes up more memory.
- Burst shot: Take a series of photos of moving subjects.
- Tap to take pics: Tap the image on the preview screen to take photos.
- Face detection: Set the device to recognize people's faces and help you take photos of them.
- Metering: Select a metering method. This determines how light values are calculated.
   Centre-weighted measures background light in the centre of the scene. Spot measures the light value at a specific location. Matrix averages the entire scene.
- **ISO**: Select an ISO value. This controls camera light sensitivity. It is measured in film-camera equivalents. Low values are for stationary or brightly-lit objects. Higher values are for fast-moving or poorly-lit objects.
- Smart stabilisation/Video stabilisation: Activate or deactivate anti-shake. Anti-shake helps prevent blur when the camera is moving.
- Save as: Set the device to delete the original photo when taking photos with rich tone mode.

- Audio zoom: Make louder the sound from the zoomed subject while recording.
- Location tag: Attach a GPS location tag to the photo. Activate this feature when taking photos to create albums in **Story Album**.



- To improve GPS signals, avoid shooting in locations where the signal may be obstructed, such as between buildings or in low-lying areas, or in poor weather conditions.
- Your location may appear on your photos when you upload them to the Internet.
   To avoid this, deactivate the GPS tag setting.
- Review: Briefly display photos taken.
- Volume key: Set the device to use the Volume button to control the shutter or zoom function.
- Timer: Use this for delayed-time shots.
- White balance: Select an appropriate white balance, so images have a true-to-life colour range. The settings are designed for specific lighting situations. These settings are similar to the heat range for white-balance exposure in professional cameras.
- **Exposure value**: Change the exposure value. This determines how much light the camera's sensor receives. For lowlight situations, use a higher exposure.
- **Guidelines**: Display viewfinder guides to help composition when selecting subjects.
- Flash: Activate or deactivate the flash.
- **Voice control**: Set the camera to take photos with voice commands.
- **Contextual filename**: Set the camera to display contextual tags. Activate this to use Tag Buddy in **Gallery** and **Story Album**.
- Save as flipped: Invert the image to create a mirror-image of the original scene.
- Storage: Select the memory location for storage.
- Reset: Reset the camera settings.

#### **Shortcuts**

Reorganize shortcuts for easy access to the camera's various options.

Tap  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  Edit quick settings.

Tap and hold an option and drag it to a slot at the top of the screen. The other icons can be moved within the list by tapping and dragging them.

# **Gallery**

Use this application to view images and videos.

Tap **Gallery** on the Applications screen.

#### Viewing images

Launching **Gallery** displays available folders. When another application, such as **Email**, saves an image, the **Download folder** is automatically created to contain the image. Likewise, capturing a screenshot automatically creates the **Screenshots** folder. Select a folder to open it.

In a folder, images are displayed by creation date. Select an image to view it in full screen. Scroll left or right to view the next or previous image.

#### **Zooming in and out**

Use one of the following methods to zoom in an image:

- Double-tap anywhere to zoom in.
- Spread two fingers apart on any place to zoom in. Pinch to zoom out, or double-tap to return.

#### Viewing images using the motion feature

Use the motion feature to execute a function with particular motion.

On the Applications screen, tap **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Controls**  $\rightarrow$  **Motions**, drag the **Motions** switch to the right, and then turn on the switch for each feature.

To stop using a motion feature, turn off the switch for the feature.

- Rotate right: Rotate clockwise.
- **Crop**: Resize the blue frame to crop and save the image in it.
- **Set as**: Set the image as wallpaper or a contact image.
- Details: View image details.
- **Settings**: Change the Gallery settings.

To change the split type, tap ≤.

### Checking your health information

View your information on the S Health home screen.

On the S Health menu screen, tap **Home**.



View your health board data on a graph.


To enter burned calories, tap Calories burnt.

To enter calories ingested, tap **Calorie intake**.

#### **Using the Walking mate**

Set a target number of steps and track your daily steps and burned calories.

On the S Health home screen, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Walking mate.



Tap **Start** to count your steps. Tap **Pause** to save the records.

To change the target number of steps, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Set goal, enter a target, and then tap **Done**.



#### **Using the Exercise mate**


Tap **Go to workout** to set an exercise goal such as distance, time, calories, or intensity, and then tap **Start**.



To change the range for the ideal temperature or humidity, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Adjust comfort range.




- Measure the temperature and humidity in a stable indoor environment.
- The temperature and humidity may vary depending on the ambient environment, device temperature, or your physical contact with the device.
- Measurements may take some time if there are sudden changes in temperature or humidity.
- For accurate measurements, use a thermo-hygrometer.

#### Managing weight

Record your weight changes and manage the weight data to maintain your appropriate Body Mass Index (BMI).

On the S Health home screen, tap  $\blacksquare \rightarrow$  Weight.



Tap **Update** to enter the weight data. Enter a value, and then tap **Done**. Whenever you change the weight data, the device applies the data to your profile.

You can connect a measuring device and record your weight. Tap  $\longrightarrow$  **Scan**, select a measuring device, and then follow the on-screen instructions to connect the measuring device.

Tap the buttons at the bottom of the screen to communicate with another person via spoken translation.

Tap **Speak** for your language, and then speak into the microphone. The device will translate what you say. Tap (1) in the target language field to let the device read the translation out loud.

Then, tap **Speak** for the language of the person you are talking with and let the person reply in their language. The device will translate what they say. Tap (1) in the source language field to let the device read it back to you.



Using GPS satellites allows you to locate places of interest at the street level, however this requires a clear view of the sky and uses more battery power..

- Help: Access help information for Wi-Fi.

#### Setting Wi-Fi sleep policy

#### **Tethering and portable hotspot**

  - **Dominant hand**: Select the left or right hand for easy assistant menu use.
  - **Edit**: Customize the items that appear on the assistant menu.
- Tap and hold delay: Set the recognition time for tapping and holding the screen.
- Interaction control: Set an area of the screen to be excluded from touch inputs.

### Call

Customize the settings for calling features.

- Call rejection: Reject calls from specified phone numbers automatically. Add phone numbers to the reject list.
- Set up call reject messages: Add or edit the message sent when you reject a call.
- Answering/ending calls:
  - The home key answers calls: Set the device to answer an incoming call when pressing the Home button.
  - Voice control: Set the device to answer or reject an incoming call with voice commands.

  - Ringtones: Select a ringtone to alert you to incoming calls.

  - **Vibrate when ringing**: Set the device to vibrate and play a ringtone for incoming calls.
  - **Keypad tones**: Set the device to sound when tapping the buttons on the keypad.
- Personalize call sound: Select a type of call sound to use with a headset.
- **Noise reduction**: Set the device to remove background noise so that the other party can hear you more clearly.

- Auto-punctuate: Set the device to insert a full stop when you double-tap the space bar.
- None: Disable text entry by sweeping on the keyboard.
- Continuous input: Enable text entry by sweeping on the keyboard.
- **Cursor control**: Enable or disable the smart keyboard navigation feature to move the cursor by scrolling the keyboard.
- **Sound**: Set the device to sound when a key is touched.
- Vibration: Set the device to vibrate when a key is touched.
- Character preview: Set the device to display a large image of each character tapped.
- Pen detection: Set the device to open the handwriting panel when the field is tapped

with the S Pen.

- **Help**: Access help information for using the Samsung keyboard.
- Reset settings: Reset Samsung keyboard settings.

### Google voice typing

To change the voice input settings, tap .

- Choose input languages: Select input languages for text input.
- **Block offensive words**: Set the device to prevent the device from recognising offensive words in voice inputs.
- **Download offline speech recognition**: Download and install language data for offline voice input.

### Handwriting recognition

Select a search language for handwriting search.

#### Voice search

- Language: Select a language for the voice recognition.
- **Speech output**: Set the device to provide voice feedback to alert you to the current action.
- Block offensive words: Hide offensive words from voice search results.
- Download offline speech recognition: Download and install language data for offline voice input.
- **Bluetooth headset**: Set the device to allow a voice search with a Bluetooth headset, when it is connected to the device.

### **Text-to-speech options**

- **Preferred TTS engine**: Select a speech synthesis engine. To change the settings for speech synthesis engines, tap ...
- **Speech rate**: Select a speed for the text-to-speech feature.
- Listen to an example: Listen to the spoken text for an example.

### Pointer speed

Adjust the pointer speed for the mouse or trackpad connected to your device.

### Voice control

Set the device to recognize voice commands for controlling your device. You can select the features to control with voice commands.



If **Vibrate when ringing** is activated, the device will not be able to recognize voice commands when a call comes in.

# Hands-free mode

Set the device to read contents aloud and specify applications to use in hands-free mode.

### S Pen

Change the settings for using the S Pen.

- **Disable pen detection**: Set the screen not to respond when inserting or removing the S Pen.
- **S Pen keeper**: Set the device to display a pop-up alert and emit a sound if you walk when the touch screen is off and S Pen is removed from the device.
- **Pointer:** Set the device to show the pointer when you hover the S Pen over the screen.
- **Direct pen input**: Set the device to launch handwriting pad when hovering the S Pen over a text input field.
- **Pen detachment options**: Set the device to launch action memo or general air commands when the S Pen is pulled out from the slot.

  - **Icon label (by pen nib)**: View simple information for an item in a pop-up window by pointing at the item with the S Pen.
  - **List scrolling**: While viewing emails or webpages, hold the S Pen over the edge of the screen to scroll through the page.
  - Sound and haptic feedback: Set the device to sound and vibrate when pointing at items with your finger.

- Air view finger options:

Change the settings for managing settings and data.

- Back up my data: Set the device to back up settings and application data to the Google server.
- Backup account: Set up or edit your Google backup account.
- **Automatic restore**: Set the device to restore settings and application data when the applications are reinstalled on the device.
- Factory data reset: Reset settings to the factory default values and delete all data.

### Date and time

Access and alter the following settings to control how the device displays the time and date.



If the battery remains fully discharged or removed from the device, the time and date is reset.

- Automatic date and time: Automatically update the time and date when moving across time zones.
- Set date: Set the current date manually.
- **Set time**: Set the current time manually.
- Automatic time zone: Set the device to receive time zone information from the network when you move across time zones.
- **Select time zone**: Set the home time zone.
- Use 24-hour format: Display time in 24-hour format.
- Select date format: Select a date format.

# **Accessory**

Change the accessory settings.

- **Dock sound**: Set the device to play a sound when your device is connected to or removed from a desktop dock.
- Audio output mode: Set the device to use the dock speaker when your device is connected to a desktop dock.
- Desk home screen display: Set the device to show the desk clock when your device is connected to a desktop dock.
- Automatic unlock: Set the device to unlock automatically when the cover is flipped open.
- **S view window colour**: Select a background colour for the S view cover screen.
- Select info shown cover: Customize the information that appears on the S view cover screen.
- Audio output: Select a sound output format to use when connecting your device to HDMI devices. Some devices may not support the surround sound setting.

# **Application manager**

View and manage the applications on your device.

# **Battery**

View the amount of battery power consumed by your device.

# Power saving mode

Activate power-saving mode and change the settings for power-saving mode.

- CPU power saving: Set the device to limit some system resource usage.
- Screen power saving: Set the device to decrease the brightness of the display.
- Turn off haptic feedback: Set the device to turn off the vibration when touching keys.
- Learn about Power saving: Discover how to reduce battery consumption.

# **Storage**

View memory information for your device and memory card, or format a memory card.



Formatting a memory card permanently deletes all data from it.



The actual available capacity of the internal memory is less than the specified capacity because the operating system and default applications occupy part of the memory. The available capacity may change when you upgrade the device.

# **Security**

Change settings for securing the device and the SIM or USIM card.

• Encrypt device: Set a password to encrypt data saved on the device. You must enter the password each time you turn on the device.



Charge the battery before enabling this setting because it may take more than an hour to encrypt your data.

• Encrypt external SD card: Set a password to encrypt data saved on the inserted microSD card.



If you reset your device to the factory defaults with this setting enabled, the device will not be able to read your encrypted files. Disable this setting before resetting the device.

- Remote controls: Set the device to allow control of your lost or stolen device remotely via the Internet. To use this feature, you must sign in to your Samsung account.
  - Account registration: Add or view your Samsung account.
  - Use wireless networks: Set the device to allow location data collection or to determine the location of your lost or stolen device via Wi-Fi or mobile network.
- SIM Change Alert: Activate or deactivate the Find my mobile feature which helps locate the device when lost or stolen.
- Go to the find my mobile webpage: Access the Find my mobile website (findmymobile.samsung.com). You can track and control your lost or stolen device on the Find my mobile website.
- Reactivation lock: Set the device to require your Samsung account after the device has been reset to prevent others from reactivating the device.
- Set up SIM card lock:
  - Lock SIM card: Activate or deactivate the PIN lock feature to require the PIN before

using the device.

- **Change SIM PIN:** Change the PIN used to access SIM or USIM data.
- Make passwords visible: By default, the device hides passwords for security. Set the device to display passwords as they are entered.
- **Device administrators**: View device administrators installed on the device. You can allow device administrators to apply new policies to the device.
- **Unknown sources**: Choose to install applications from any source. If not chosen, download applications only from Play Store.
- **Verify apps**: Set this to allow Google to check the application for harmful behaviour before installing it.
- Change security level: Modify the security level for credential files.
- Auto update security: Automatically download security policy updates that improve security and service.
- **Via Wi-Fi only**: Automatically update the security policy only when device is connected to a Wi-Fi network.
- **Storage type**: Set a storage type for credential files.
- Trusted credentials: Use certificates and credentials to ensure secure use of various applications.
- Install from device storage: Install encrypted certificates stored on the USB storage.
- Clear credentials: Erase the credential contents from the device and reset the password.

# **Troubleshooting**

Before contacting a Samsung Service Centre, please attempt the following solutions. Some situations may not apply to your device.

# When you turn on your device or while you are using the device, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

- Password: When the device lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the device.
- PIN: When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you
  must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. You can disable this feature by
  using the Lock SIM card menu.
- PUK: Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
- PIN2: When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM or USIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

## Your device displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again. While moving, error messages may appear repeatedly.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

### Your device does not turn on

- When the battery is completely discharged, your device will not turn on. Charge the battery completely before turning on the device.
- The battery may not be inserted properly. Insert the battery again.
- Wipe both gold-coloured contacts and insert the battery again.

# The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

- If you attach a protective cover or optional accessories to the touch screen, the touch screen may not function properly.
- If you are wearing gloves, if your hands are not clean while touching the touch screen, or if you tap the screen with sharp objects or your fingertips, the touch screen may malfunction.
- The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, visit a Samsung Service Centre.

### Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close applications or reinsert the battery and turn on the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the Power button for more than 7 seconds to reboot.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. On the Applications screen, tap Settings  $\rightarrow$  General  $\rightarrow$  Backup and reset  $\rightarrow$  Factory data reset  $\rightarrow$  Reset device  $\rightarrow$  Erase everything. Before performing the factory data reset, remember to make back-up copies of all important data stored on the device.

If the problem is still not resolved, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### Calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

# Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

# Sound echoes during a call

Adjust the volume by pressing the Volume button or move to another area.

# A cellular network or the Internet is often disconnected or audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the device's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. You may have connectivity problems due to issues with the service provider's base station. Move to another area and try again.
- When using the device while moving, wireless network services may be disabled due to issues with the service provider's network.

# The battery icon is empty

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery.

# The battery does not charge properly (For Samsung-approved chargers)

- Ensure that the charger is connected properly.
- If the battery terminals are dirty, the battery may not charge properly or the device may turn off. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts and try charging the battery again.
- The batteries in some devices are not user-replaceable. To have the battery replaced, visit a Samsung Service Centre.

# The battery depletes faster than when first purchased

- When you expose the battery to very cold or very hot temperatures, the useful charge may be reduced.
- Battery consumption increases when you use messaging features or some applications, such as games or the Internet.
- The battery is consumable and the useful charge will get shorter over time.

### Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

# Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your device must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a computer or deleting files from your device.
- Restart the device. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

## Photo quality is poorer than the preview

- The quality of your photos may vary, depending on the surroundings and the photography techniques you use.
- If you take photos in dark areas, at night, or indoors, image noise may occur or images may be out of focus.

# Error messages appear when opening multimedia files

If you receive error messages or files do not play, when opening multimedia files on your device, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a computer or deleting files from your device.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM-protected, ensure that you have the appropriate licence or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your device supports the file type.

### **Troubleshooting**

- Your device supports photos and videos captured with the device. Photos and videos captured by other devices may not work properly.
- Your device supports multimedia files that are authorized by your network service provider or providers of additional services. Some content circulated on the Internet, such as ringtones, videos, or wallpapers, may not work properly.

### Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to.
- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

# A connection is not established when you connect the device to a computer

- Ensure that the USB cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper driver installed and updated on your computer.
- If you are a Windows XP user, ensure that you have Windows XP Service Pack 3 or higher installed on your computer.
- Ensure that you have Samsung Kies or Windows Media Player 10 or higher installed on your computer.

# Your device cannot find your current location

GPS signals may be obstructed in some locations, such as indoors. Set the device to use Wi-Fi or a mobile network to find your current location in these situations.

### Data stored on the device has been lost

Always make backup copies of all important data stored on the device. Otherwise, you cannot restore data if it is corrupted or lost. Samsung is not responsible for the loss of data stored on the device.

# A small gap appears around the outside of the device case

- This gap is a necessary manufacturing feature and some minor rocking or vibration of parts may occur.
- Over time, friction between parts may cause this gap to expand slightly.

# **Health and Safety**

This safety information contains content for mobile devices. Some content may be not applicable to your device. To prevent injury to yourself and others or damage to your device, read the safety information about your device before using the device.



Warning: Failure to comply with safety warnings and regulations can cause serious injury or death.

### Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or loose electrical sockets

Unsecured connections can cause electric shock or fire.

# Do not touch the power cord with wet hands or disconnect the charger by pulling the cord

Doing so may result in electrocution.

#### Do not bend or damage the power cord

Doing so may cause electric shock or fire.

#### Do not use your device while it is charging or touch your device with wet hands

Doing so may cause electric shock.

### Do not short-circuit the charger or the device

Doing so may cause electric shock or fire, or the battery may malfunction or explode.

### Do not use your device outdoor during a thunderstorm

Doing so may result in electric shock or device malfunction.

## Use manufacturer-approved chargers, accessories, and supplies

- Using generic batteries or chargers may shorten the life of your device or cause the device to malfunction. They may also cause a fire or cause the battery to explode.

- Samsung cannot be responsible for the user's safety when using accessories or supplies that are not approved by Samsung.
- Do not drop or cause an impact to the charger or the device

### Handle and dispose of the device and charger with care

- Never dispose of the battery or device in a fire. Never place the device on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. The device may explode when overheated. Follow all local regulations when disposing of used battery or device.
- Never crush or puncture the device.

• Avoid exposing the device to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

### Protect the device and charger from damage

- Avoid exposing your device and battery to very cold or very hot temperatures.
- Extreme temperatures can damage the device and reduce the charging capacity and life of your device and battery.
- Prevent the battery from coming into contact with metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and – terminals of your battery and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
